## On 26<sup>th</sup> September 2024



#### Dear Sir

The FT book review on 10 May 2025 of "The Manifesto House" by Owen Hopkins, highlights the authors fatuous claim that "architects" agency and influence have never been lower". This is certainly not the case for the architects' profession in the UK and particularly in London. The contrary is globally true for UK architects!

Data published in the recent report by the Worshipful Company of Chartered Architects (City of London Livery Company) "London: The Global Hub of Architecture" (April 2024) establishes that the UK and London is increasingly the world leading centre for international professional services in architecture. This assertion is based on comprehensive statistical data provided by detailed surveys by the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA), the Architects' Council of Europe (ACE) and WA100 survey of the world's top architecture in 2024.

Here are some key facts:

- Compared to any other country, the UK has the highest number of the World's Top 100 architecture practices (33%).
- London has the greatest concentration of international and UK architects in the World.
   The value of the international earnings of UK based RIBA Chartered Practices increased
- by an astonishing 43% from 2022-2024.
- 27% of London based UK chartered practice architects' earnings (17% UK-wide) are from international projects, compared to less than 3% for the EU.

The FT and the UK Government should be proudly promoting the global dominance and the value of the UK's Architectural Profession to UK plc. One of the few claims that can be made by UK politicians of the UK's world leading position that is true!






