

The Role of the BACCH Regional Co-ordinator

There are 16 BACCH Regional Co-ordinators across the UK (<u>list of regions and current post-holders</u>) and they play a vital role in supporting the work of BACCH at a regional level.

The four-year voluntary role is open to consultants and SAS doctors who are current members of BACCH, or willing to join. (Trainees who are interested in being involved with BACCH locally can become a Regional Trainee Rep.)

Job Description

- 1. Co-ordinate BACCH activities in the region and be a point of contact for local members
- 2. To work with the <u>BACCH Regional Trainee Representative</u> for their area
- 3. Organise at least one BACCH Regional meeting a year
- 4. Maximise membership of BACCH through the promotion of the organisation with students, trainees and other paediatricians in the region
- 5. Cascade information on BACCH activities to members in their Region
- 6. Contribute to, and encourage regional members to participate in, consultation documents
- 7. Be a member of BACCH Council, which meets twice a year (usually in June and December attendance in person at RCPCH office in London, or remotely via MS Teams)
- 8. Write a report on BACCH activities in your region for 'BACCH News', as appropriate.
- 9. To liaise with the relevant <u>College Regional CCH Lead</u>, on education and training for community trainees.
- 10. At their end of their term, to seek a suitable replacement amongst the regional BACCH members (and if unsuccessful, liaise with the BACCH office to advertise the role)

It is estimated that the role requires one hour per week (equivalent to 0.25 PA).

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
