

# BACCH Trainee Newsletter Editor – Job Description

Are you an ST6-8 Community trainee who would like experience working as a Trainee Editor of a quarterly Newsletter focussed on issues related to Community Child Health?

This is a fantastic opportunity to be involved in developing the content, design and reach of BACCH News, a Newsletter that goes out to all over 950 members every three months.

Self-nominations are sought to serve for two years alongside the Newsletter Editor.

## Role description:

- 1. To work closely with the (Consultant) Newsletter Editor and the BACCH Executive Officer
- 2. Seek out new content for the quarterly Newsletter
- 3. Develop the Author Guidelines to ensure they are always relevant and up-to-date
- 4. Respond to queries from potential authors to support in developing article ideas
- 5. Contribute to strategic discussions about Newsletter themes
- 6. Contribute to design discussions about Newsletter formatting
- 7. Review, edit and comment on submitted articles, responding promptly to authors with both positive and constructive feedback, if necessary
- 8. Attend quarterly meetings with the Newsletter team to discuss development of the Newsletter, ideas and opportunities to improve the Newsletter (both content and reach)
- 9. Identify events or courses that might benefit from being advertised through the Newsletter
- 10. Encourage colleagues to write articles for the Newsletter, particularly covering topical issues
- 11. Promote the Newsletter amongst your colleagues and networks
- 12. (You will not be a member of BACCH Executive or BACCH Council, but will be welcome to join the twice-yearly meetings for the latter.)

## Time commitment:

The lead up to each quarterly edition of BACCH News tends to be the busiest time, requiring approximately 2-4 hours per week during the three weeks before publication. (*Mid Feb-early March, mid May-early June, mid August-early September, mid November-early December.*) In between editions, time commitment is approximately 2 hours per month.

## Eligibility:

This is a role intended for ST6-8 Trainees in Community Paediatrics. GRID or non-GRID trainees in Community Child Health or Neurodisability are welcome to apply. We ask that applicants are either current members of BACCH or are willing to join.

Please send a CV (3 pages max) along with a brief statement (250 words) outlining your experience and reasons for wanting to take up the role.
