### Dr Cath Harrison

**Consultant Neonatologist, Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust, UK**

I have been a consultant neonatologist in Leeds since 2004 with training and experience from the UK, Australia and South Africa. I am also the Clinical Lead for Embrace, a combined neonatal and paediatric transfer service in the UK, carrying out over 2000 transfers per year. I am the chair of the UK Neonatal Transport Group.

I am passionate about education, governance and quality of care to improve neonatal outcomes. I am the UK training advisor for Royal College Subspecialty Advisory Committee for neonatology having been the CSAC chair for 6 years. I have a long standing interest in global health and have worked for the last 25 years in lower middle income countries developing education and training packages.



### Dr Morag Campbell

**Consultant Neonatologist, NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde, UK**

Morag completed her undergraduate medical degree at the University of Edinburgh. Her sub-specialty training in Neonatal Medicine took her to training posts in tertiary centres across the UK including Edinburgh, Liverpool and London and she completed her Neonatal Fellowship in Edmonton, Canada.

Morag has over 20 years' experience as a Consultant Neonatologist, working in large tertiary Neonatal Services in the UK and Canada, she is currently a Consultant Neonatologist at the NICU at the Royal Hospital for Children Glasgow, this 50 bed unit is the largest in Scotland and provides care for babies born at extremes of prematurity to those born at term with complex surgical, cardiac and congenital anomalies.



From 2007-2011 she was Head of Service for Neonatology at Guy's & St Thomas NHS Foundation Trust in London. After moving to Glasgow she was appointed in 2013 as Clinical Director for Critical Care, Cardiac Services and Neonatology and from 2017 Clinical Director for Critical Care and Neonatology. In 2022 Morag moved to a role in governance where she is currently the Joint Clinical Lead for Adverse Events for Hospital Paediatrics and Neonates for NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde. In addition to clinical roles Morag has been engaged in the training and education of future neonatologists throughout her career. Since 2012 she has been actively involved in the annual national recruitment process for Neonatal sub-specialty training in the UK, from 2015-2018 she was the CSAC Training Advisor and since the end of 2018 has been the Chair of Neonatal College Specialty Advisory Committee for the RCPCH in this role she has led the neonatal national recruitment process and the annual progress review for all Neonatal Sub-specialty trainees across the UK.

In addition to her clinical roles has worked with charitable organisations, including Tommy's Charity, was a Trustee and Clinical Advisor for Best Beginnings from 2010 – 2016. Morag has worked with Newborns Vietnam supporting the training and education of Vietnamese neonatal doctors since 2018 and chairs the Newborns Vietnam Education Review Group.

Shanthi Shanmugalingam is a consultant neonatologist and medical educator with a passion for improving maternal and neonatal care. She was a consultant at Luton and Dunstable Hospital in the East of England before joining the Starlight neonatal team at Barnet Hospital, Royal Free London NHS Foundation Trust in 2014.

She has been involved in several successful quality improvement initiatives including the East of England Neuroprotection project, iSim project introducing point of care neonatal simulation in every neonatal unit across the East of England, the Royal Free Keeping Mothers and Babies Together clinical pathway (@MumBaby2gether) and the Neonatal Journey Home: FiCARE clinical pathway. Shanthi is a Training Programme Director for the London School of Paediatrics, deputy Director of Medical Education at the Royal Free London and the RCPCH neonatal CSAC SPIN representative.

He is a member of the International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation Newborn Life Support task force. He has developed difficult airway teaching using simulation, debriefed real difficult airway events and run into several difficult airways in clinical practice.

**Lecturer in Perinatal and Paediatric Research, UK**

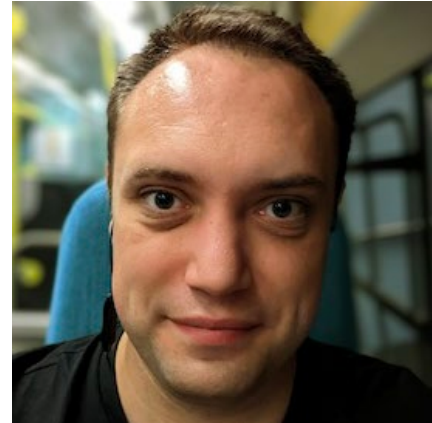

I have linked the National Neonatal Research Database with other sources to explore the healthcare needs of children who require neonatal and PICU care in the early years of their life. I also support research in other areas including: transport; brain injury and pregnancy and baby loss.

Clinical Lecturer in Child Health, University Hospital Southampton, UK

I am a neonatal grid trainee in Wessex Deanery and an NIHR Clinical Lecturer in Child Health at the University of Southampton. I sit on the Methodology & Dataset Group of the National Neonatal Audit Programme (NNAP) as the trainee representative. My research focuses on optimising the growth of preterm infants. I have used NNAP reporting to guide QI projects to improve perinatal care in Southampton and Portsmouth, and I have led collection of data for submission to NNAP and the Vermont Oxford Network in
