



Nano Preterm Committee – Role Descriptions

1. Allied Health Professionals, Pharmacy and Psychological Professionals

To be eligible to apply for this role you must:

- Be employed in a UK NICU
- Be a BAPM member.

You will be expected to:

- Attend a minimum of 2 meetings of the Nano Preterm SIG a year (or ensure attendance by a deputy)
- Support and disseminate research, education and QI initiatives and resources relating to work of the Nano Preterm SIG throughout your professional group / organisation.
- Be aware of current recommendations relating to AHP care of 22-23 week infants/extreme preterm infants
- Represent the views of the wider AHP group within the SIG
- Stay abreast of the evidence pertaining to the role of the AHP in Nano Preterm care and outcomes.

2. Midwives

To be eligible to apply for this role you must:

- Be employed in a UK tertiary centre with a co-located NICU
- Hold a local or network role in preterm birth
- Be a BAPM member.

You will be expected to:

- Attend a minimum of 2 meetings of the Nano Preterm SIG a year (or ensure attendance by a Deputy)
- Support and disseminate research, education and QI initiatives and resources relating to work of the Nano Preterm SIG throughout your professional group / organisation.
- Be aware of current recommendations relating to Midwifery care of mothers of 22-23 week infants
- Represent the views of the Midwifery community within the SIG
- Stay abreast of the evidence pertaining to the role of the Midwife in Nano Preterm care and outcomes



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3. Obstetricians

To be eligible to apply for this role you must:

- Be employed in a UK tertiary centre with a co-located NICU
- Be a national, network or local lead for preterm birth eg has experience in developing local guidelines for preterm births; membership of national or regional preterm birth working groups
- Be a BAPM member.

You will be expected to:

- Attend a minimum of 2 meetings of the Nano Preterm SIG a year (or ensure attendance by a deputy)
- Support and disseminate research, education and QI initiatives and resources relating to work of the Nano Preterm SIG throughout your professional group / organisations
- Be aware of current recommendations relating to Obstetric care of mothers of 22-23 week infants.
- Represent the views of the Obstetric community within the SIG
- Stay abreast of the evidence pertaining to the role of the Obstetrician in Nano Preterm care and outcomes

4. Resident Doctor

To be eligible to apply for this role you must:

- Be a UK grid trainee ST6/7
- Be a BAPM member.

You will be expected to:

- Attend a minimum of 2 meetings of the Nano Preterm SIG a year
- Support and disseminate research, education initiatives and resources relating to work of the Nano Preterm SIG throughout your professional group
- Stay abreast of the evidence pertaining to Nano Preterm care and outcomes.



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5. Nurse/ANNP

To be eligible to apply for this role you must:

- Be employed in a UK NICU
- Be a local, network or national role in preterm birth/infants eg. has experience in developing local neonatal guidelines for extreme preterm infants; membership of regional or national preterm birth working groups
- Be a BAPM member.

You will be expected to:

- Attend a minimum of 2 meetings of the Nano Preterm SIG a year (or ensure attendance by a Deputy)
- Support and disseminate research, education and initiatives and resources relating to work of the Nano Preterm SIG throughout your professional group / organisation.
- Be aware of current recommendations relating to Neonatal Nursing care of 22-23 week infants.
- Represent the views of Neonatal Nurses within the SIG
- Stay abreast of the evidence pertaining to the role of the Neonatal Nurse in Nano Preterm care and outcomes

6. SCU/LNU paediatrician/neonatologist

To be eligible to apply for this role you must:

- Be employed in a LNU/SCU
- Hold a local or network role in preterm birth
- Be a BAPM member

You will be expected to:

- Attend a minimum of 2 meetings of the Nano Preterm SIG a year (or ensure attendance by a Deputy)
- Support and disseminate research, education initiatives and resources relating to work of the Nano Preterm SIG throughout your professional group.
- Be aware of current recommendations relating to neonatal care of 22-23 week infants
- Represent LNU/SCUs and be able to describe the challenges faced by LNU/SCUs throughout the UK in delivering optimal care for 22-23 week infants and their mothers.
