

Fundraising and Communications Volunteer

This is a fantastic opportunity to gain hands on practical experience in fundraising and communications at a leading charity challenging the injustice of immigration detention in the UK.

We provide legal advice and representation to people detained in removal centers and prisons to help them secure their release, alongside research and policy advocacy to effect change.

You will work closely with the Fundraising and Communications Coordinator to support our campaigns and events programme, create materials for clients and create content for our website, newsletter and social media platforms.

We've listed some qualities below that would be helpful for the role but please do not feel you need to meet all of them. No previous experience of fundraising or the charity sector is required, only a passion for human rights and a positive approach are needed!

- Lived experience of the UK's immigration system
- Experience of campaigning
- Digital skills (Microsoft Office, Social Media, graphic design etc.)
- Great communication skills, both written and spoken
- Experience of producing written documents for a variety of audiences
- Fluent written and spoken English
- A positive approach with plenty of initiative and a willingness to take on feedback
- Keenness to keep learning and developing new skills
- Passionate about human rights and social justice
- Knowledge of the asylum/immigration/detention policy environment in the UK
- Experience of carrying out and transcribing case study interviews
- Experience organising events
- Experience in fundraising or communications
- Experience with press/media work

We are hoping that you will be able to commit to at least one full day once a week in the Office, Tuesday – Wednesday for at least 6 weeks.
