Speaker Biographies

Jason Williams (Key Note Speaker Opening)



Jason Williams aka Cloud Gardener UK aims to inspire a new generation of urban gardener by sharing his expertise of container gardening and encouraging more urban residents to maximise on their unique growing spaces like a balcony garden.

It's his belief that everyone deserves access to greenspace and that living in the city doesn't mean that you should not be connected to nature. His Churchill Fellowship research trip took him to Milan, Barcelona, Singapore, Hong Kong & China studying urban greenspace and the positives and negatives of eco-tourism

John Foley (Holden Clough Nurseries Session 1)



When John was only twelve years old he collected crocosmias, so it is perhaps not surprising he went on to be crowned **BBC Young Gardener of the Year** in 2012.

A family business run by the Foley's since 1978 John and his wife Kate have run Holden Clough Nurseries in Bolton by Bowland since 2009.

John will be talking about the skills needed to run a retail plant nursery and why he decided to take a more old-fashioned approach to managing the business in the technological age.

Dr Luke Hailey (Bartlett Trees Session 1)
