When you are pregnant you will have regular appointments with a midwife.

A midwife cares for women and their families during pregnancy, birth and after the birth.



Some women need to see a doctor when they are pregnant, your midwife will arrange this if you need to.



Your midwife appointments might be at a Doctors surgery, a Children's centre or another clinic.

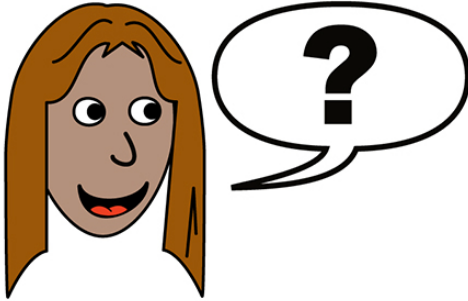

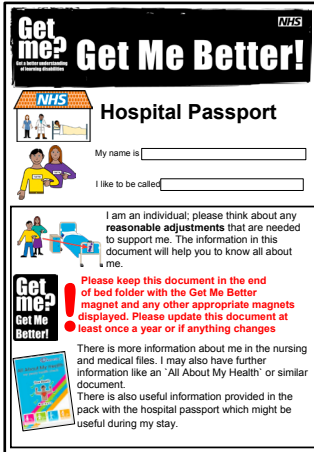

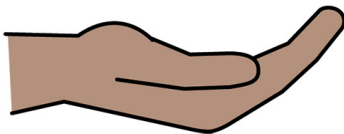


At the first appointment, your midwife will ask you:

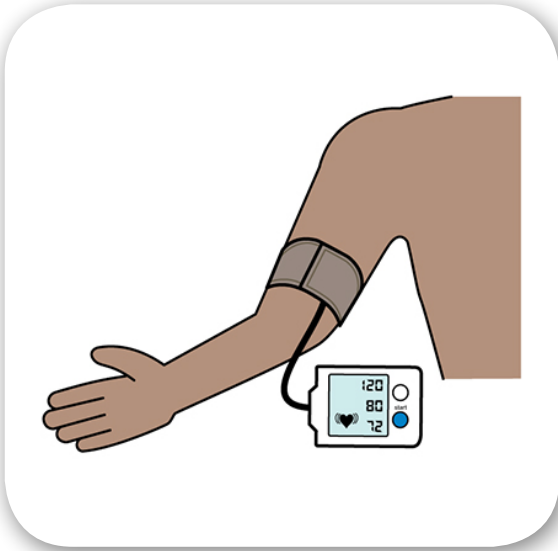
- Your name and address

- When you were born
- Questions about you and your health

It is a good idea to bring a friend or relative with you to the appointments.

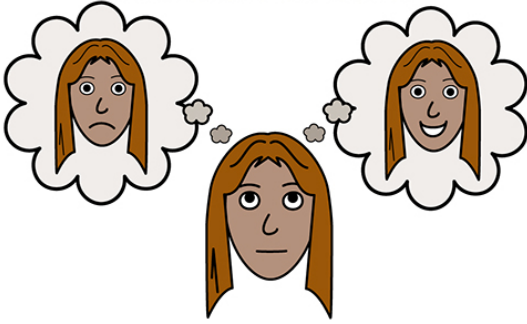


Every time you see your midwife she will:

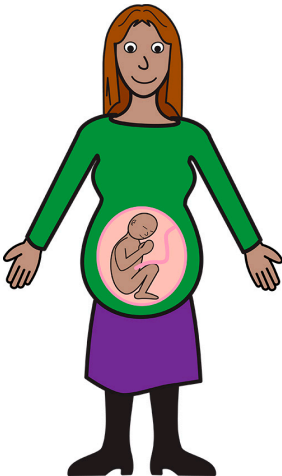
- Take your blood pressure



- Test your urine



- Talk to you about how you are feeling



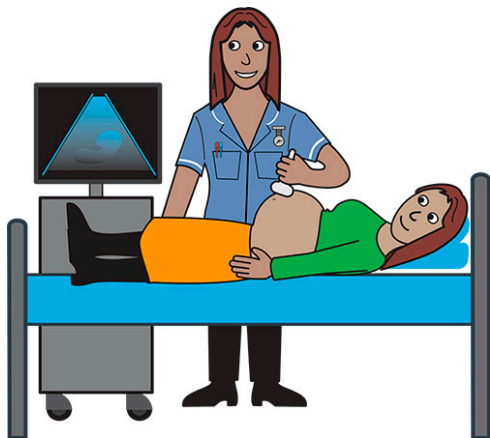
- Talk to you about your baby

Your midwife will offer you some blood tests and some scans of your baby.

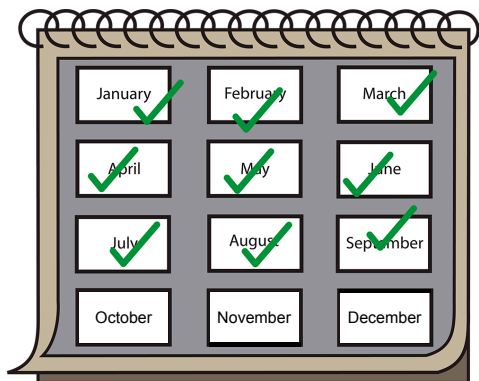
