Having a Chest X-Ray



When you arrive at the department for your x-ray. You will need to give your letter or card to the person on the reception desk.




You will need to sit in the waiting area until it is your turn to go in for an x-ray.



When it is your turn you will need to take off your shirt or top and put on a hospital gown.



The radiographer will put the x-ray machine in the right position for taking your x-ray. The radiographer will then go behind a screen to take the picture. Your carer can stay with you.



The Radiographer will ask you to stand in front of the xray machine which will take a photograph of your chest The Radiographer will make sure you

You will need to keep very still whilst you have your x-ray photograph taken because if you move the picture might not come out properly.
