

## **BARCAPEL BURSARIES**

Academic Year 2024 - 2025

## **GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS**

(2<sup>nd</sup> year of study or above)

Funds have been made available through the generous support of the Barcapel Foundation to help healthcare and veterinary practitioners training to take the MFHom and VetMFHom examinations. The bursaries will be distributed to encourage those who most need them, those who are unable to attract financial support elsewhere and those who, on completion of their studies, are likely to use homeopathic medicines regularly within their practice. Applications will be considered each academic year. The sum allocated will depend upon the number of applications and the funds available.

- 1. You need to be studying a Faculty-accredited course and have already passed the PHCE or LFHom Vet examination to be eligible for a bursary.
- 2. You must tell us about any other sources of funding you have applied for and/or received. Priority will be given to those not receiving funding from other sources.
- 3. You are encouraged to pursue the entire course of homoeopathic study up to MFHom/VetMFHom level. Bursaries are paid directly to the teaching centres and normally cover 80% of the course fees. The percentage of course fees covered may be more or less depending on the personal circumstances of applicants. If you do not not sit the MFHom or VetMFHom examination or apply for the next stage of Faculty accredited training you will be invoiced for all course materials accessed and any associated administrative costs by the teaching centre and your bursary funding will be allocated to another student.
- 4. If your application form is not countersigned by your tutor (who will confirm your course fee), it will not be processed.
- 5. To be eligible for a bursary, you must be a Licentiate member of the Faculty.
- 6. To be eligible, you must be resident in the UK and you must intend to practise within the UK. The bursary may be awarded on a discretionary basis after



considering changes in your personal circumstances due to Brexit that may affect your eligibility.

- 7. If you receive a bursary, you will be expected to complete and return a detailed feedback form, which we will send you towards the end of the academic year or after you have completed the exam.
- 8. If you are encountering any difficulties at any point in your training which will impact your ability to complete the course, please contact Lisa Peacock at <a href="mailto:lpeacock@facultyofhomeopathy.org">lpeacock@facultyofhomeopathy.org</a> as soon as possible.
- 9. The Faculty's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
