BARCAPEL BURSARIES

Academic Year 2026 – 2027

GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS

(2nd year of study or above)

Funds have been made available through the generous support of the Barcapel Foundation to help healthcare and veterinary practitioners training to take the MFHom and VetMFHom examinations. The bursaries will be distributed to encourage those who most need them, those who are unable to attract financial support elsewhere and those who, on completion of their studies, are likely to use homeopathic medicines regularly within their practice. Applications will be considered each academic year. The sum allocated will depend upon the number of applications and the funds available.

1. You need to be studying a Faculty-accredited course and have already passed the PHCE or LFHom Vet examination to be eligible for a bursary.
2. You must tell us about any other sources of funding you have applied for and/or received. Priority will be given to those not receiving funding from other sources.
3. You are encouraged to pursue the entire course of homoeopathic study up to MFHom/VetMFHom level. Bursaries normally cover 60% of the course fees. The percentage of course fees covered may be more or less depending on the personal circumstances of applicants.
4. Bursaries are paid directly to students in 2 equal instalments. The first instalment will normally be paid no more than 2-3 weeks after the application for the bursary has been approved. The second instalment will be paid directly to the student 6 – 8 months after the bursary was approved on condition that the student is still engaging with the course, attending tutorials and completing homework assignments.
5. If you are not still engaging with the course, do not sit the MFHom or VetMFHom examination or apply for the next stage of Faculty accredited training by the end of the academic year (31 August 2027) you will be invoiced by the Faculty of Homeopathy for any bursary funding received so the funding can be allocated to another student.

- 6. If your application form is not countersigned by your tutor (who will confirm your course fee), it will not be processed.**
- 7. To be eligible for a bursary, you must be a Licentiate or Diplomate member of the Faculty.**
- 8. To be eligible, you must be resident in the UK and you must intend to practise within the UK. The bursary may be awarded on a discretionary basis after considering changes in your personal circumstances due to Brexit that may affect your eligibility.**
- 9. Once your bursary has been approved you will be required to sign a student contract. Failure to sign and adhere to this contract will result in immediate withdrawal of your Barcapel bursary.**
- 10. If you receive a bursary, you will be expected to complete and return a detailed feedback form, which we will send you towards the end of the academic year or after you have completed the exam.**
- 11. If you are encountering any difficulties at any point in your training which will impact your ability to complete the course, please contact Lisa Peacock at lpeacock@facultyofhomeopathy.org as soon as possible.**
- 12. The Faculty's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.**
