EU Updates



Focused on Health Equity

On April 23, 2024, as part of the Belgian EU presidency, an expert event titled "Towards Health Equity: Strong Health Systems, Universal Health Coverage and Social Participation" was co-organized by the Belgian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Enabel, and **Be-cause Health**. This significant gathering at Lamot Center, Mechelen, underscored the urgent need for **universal health coverage** (UHC) and robust health systems to achieve **health equity**. The conference catalyzed a civil society **call to action**, advocating for a decolonial approach to the EU Global Health Strategy, enhancing inclusivity and balanced decision-making in global health governance.

The call to action, discussed at the EU Foreign Affairs Council on May 7, remains **open for endorsement**. It seeks a rights- and needs-based approach in health policies, promoting inclusiveness in global health governance, and integrating health into all policy areas.

FESTMIH members are encouraged to **engage** with this initiative by reviewing and signing the call to action. This involvement will not only support global health equity but also shape the implementation of health policies across the EU and beyond.

Global report on neglected tropical diseases 2024

Highlighting Progress: 2024 Global Report on Neglected Tropical Diseases

The World Health Organization (WHO) has recently released its 2024 **Global Report on Neglected Tropical Diseases** (NTDs), marking significant strides toward the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals. This comprehensive report provides an update on the ongoing efforts and progress made in combating NTDs, with detailed **epidemiological** and **programmatic** data from 2022 and key events from 2023.

The report is pivotal as it evaluates the global and regional advancements towards eliminating these diseases, which disproportionately affect the world's poorest communities. It includes assessments of overarching, cross-cutting, and **disease-specific indicators**, offering a clear picture of where we stand and what more **needs** to be **done**.

TROPICAL AND NEGLECTED INFECTIOUS DISEASES: AN INTEGRATED ONE HEALTH APPROACH TO PUBLIC HEALTH MULTIPROFESSIONAL

COURSE SYNOPSIS:

Overview this interdisciplinary course covers a range of topics related to infectious diseases and their impact on public health. The course emphasizes the One Health approach, which recognizes the interconnectedness of human, animal, and environmental health.

It will be discussed about the major waterborne diseases in Brazil and their implications for public health, as well as wastewater genomics surveillance strategies, transmission of arboviruses and neglected diseases such as Chaga's disease, malaria, leishmaniasis, HTLV, Hansen's disease and Tuberculosis. General aspects of disease in Brazil and current research avenues in the country also will be discussed. Finally, will be explored the sense of neglected diseases in Bahia, with a focus on the place of populations and territories. Some study visits will take place throughout the program.

- Desirable: knowledge of molecular biology, cellular biology, pathology, microbiology and ecology.
