

WHO Prequalifies First Self-Test for Hepatitis C Virus

The World Health Organization (WHO) has prequalified the first hepatitis C virus (HCV) self-test, marking a significant step in expanding global access to testing and diagnosis. The OraQuick® HCV self-test, produced by OraSure Technologies, is designed for lay users and provides a convenient, stigma-free option for individuals to test themselves at home. This initiative is expected to accelerate efforts towards the global elimination of hepatitis C by increasing the number of diagnoses and facilitating early treatment.

WHO had recommended **HCV self-testing (HCVST)** in **2021** to complement existing testing services, and this new prequalification supports that recommendation by offering a **reliable**, **user-friendly** tool for broader implementation. The addition of the OraQuick® HCV self-test to WHO's **prequalification list** is crucial for expanding **safe and effective** HCV testing, particularly in **low- and middle-income countries**. As WHO continues to support **evidence-based implementation** and work with communities, this achievement represents a **critical advancement** in the fight against hepatitis C, contributing to the **global goal** of diagnosing **90% of all people** with HCV.

WHO: New Guidelines for the Treatment of Human African Trypanosomiasis

The World Health Organization (WHO) has published updated guidelines for the treatment of human African trypanosomiasis (HAT), also known as sleeping sickness. This parasitic disease, endemic in sub-Saharan Africa, is nearly always fatal if untreated. The new guidelines reflect recent advances, including the expanded use of the medicine fexinidazole for both forms of the disease—gambiense and rhodesiense HAT. These guidelines are crucial for healthcare providers in endemic regions, as they offer detailed recommendations to ensure effective treatment and improve patient outcomes.

Meta-analysis and public policy: Reconciling the evidence on deworming Croke et al., "Meta-Analysis and Public Policy."

A new study published in **PNAS** explores the impact of **mass drug administration (MDA)** for **intestinal worm infections** on **child health outcomes**. The **meta-analysis** reaffirms significant **positive effects** of MDA on **weight, mid-upper arm circumference (MUAC)**, and **height** in regions with over **20% worm prevalence**. The study highlights MDA as a **cost-effective intervention**, especially when compared to **school feeding programs**, and calls for its continued use in **endemic areas** to improve **child health** and **nutrition**.

UKRI Applied Global Health Research: New Funding Opportunity

UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) has announced a new funding opportunity for its Applied Global Health Research program. The program, co-funded by the Medical Research Council (MRC) and the UK Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO), offers grants ranging from £150,000 to £2,000,000. The application process opens on 20 August 2024 at 9:00 AM (UK time) and closes on 3 December 2024 at 4:00 PM (UK time).

This grant aims to support research that addresses critical **global health challenges** and promotes **equitable partnerships** between UK researchers and those in **low- and middle-income countries (LMICs)**. It encourages **interdisciplinary projects** that can lead to **tangible changes in health policy and practice**. Eligible topics include **late-stage intervention development, implementation science, health economics,** and **cross-sector research**. The focus is on research that **improves health outcomes** in LMICs and contributes to **global health equity**.

- Opening Date: 20 August 2024, 9:00 AM (UK time)
- Closing Date: 3 December 2024, 4:00 PM (UK time)
- Funding Decisions: March 2025 for Stage One, with invited Stage Two applications due by 16 July 2025.

Further updates and details will be shared as we continue to progress with the planning of ECTMIH 2025.


