Topics include **facilities and equipment**, **data management**, and **quality control**. Each module includes a quiz, and participants earn a **certificate of completion** for scores above 80%.

This course is highly relevant for professionals working in resource-limited settings and those involved in clinical trials, diagnostics, or laboratory operations. The structured modules ensure a deep understanding of laboratory practices that are crucial for clinical research outcomes.

Public Health Informatics Fellowship Program (PHIFP)

The Public Health Informatics Fellowship Program (PHIFP) offers a unique two-year opportunity for professionals to apply informatics in public health. Open to individuals with a master's or doctoral degree in public health, epidemiology, computer science, or a related field, the fellowship allows participants to work on improving disease prevention and public health systems. Fellows will be required to relocate to a CDC or partner site and work on public health informatics projects. Key dates include an orientation in September 2025, with a start in August 2025. During the fellowship, participants will gain hands-on experience in using informatics to tackle public health challenges. Eligibility Requirements:

- A master's or doctoral degree in public health, informatics, computer science, or related fields.
- Research experience: Publications, thesis writing, poster presentations, or proposals.
- Willingness to relocate to a CDC location.

Application Process:

Lymphatic Filariasis Morbidity Management and Disability Prevention Course

Duration: 5 hours (self-paced)

Platform: OpenWHO Language: English

This course, developed by WHO, is designed for national neglected tropical disease focal points, health professionals, and care providers working in Lymphatic Filariasis (LF)-endemic countries. It covers the strategies of the Global Programme to Eliminate Lymphatic Filariasis (GPELF), focusing on the management of lymphoedema, elephantiasis, and hydrocele. The course includes practical modules on clinical care, mental health support, and the programmatic steps required for validating LF elimination as a public health problem.

Course Highlights:

- Module 1: Introduction to GPELF, LF transmission, and programmatic strategies.
- Module 2: Clinical management of lymphoedema, elephantiasis, and hydrocele.
- **Module 3 (optional)**: Programmatic aspects of the LF elimination program, including care provision and evaluation.

Certification:

Participants who score at least **80%** on the final assessment will receive a **Certificate of Achievement** and can download an **Open Badge** for this course.

This course offers a unique opportunity to enhance skills in managing LF morbidity, with the goal of supporting national efforts to eliminate LF as a public health problem.
