Outlines recent developments of industrial animal agriculture in Britain and illustrates how it has increasingly modelled itself after the US concept of intensive farms.

<u>Fowl Play: The chicken farmers being bullied by big poultry</u> (The Guardian, 2017) Details the ways in which large, industrialized meat corporations shift the burden of animal agriculture onto individual farmers.

"Ag-gag laws" hide the cruelty of factory farms from the public. Courts are striking them down (Vox, 2019)

Details the legal basis for Ag gag legislature, and the ways it inhibits successful protesting against animal abuse.

Investigates the existing paradox in people both liking animals and liking to eat animals, indicating that study participants unconsciously suppressed their moral concern for animals after eating meat to evade this conflict.
