Explains the association between economic hardship placed on rural families in Kenya through climate change and increasing rates of child marriage, thus illustrating that the dangers of climate change are not evenly distributed among populations but tend to fall on those in vulnerable positions.

Highlights the necessity of improving resilience of those living in or close to poverty against climate change by providing them with social protection schemes.
