

Marginal Plants in DURL Project's Integrated Constructed Wetlands

Scientific Name	Common Name	Description
<i>Irish pseudacorus</i>	Yellow Iris/Flag Iris	Sturdy, yellow flowers, May-July, will slowly spread, but not invasive in the medium term
<i>Caltha palustris</i>	Marsh Marigold	Large yellow buttercup flowers in early spring, compact, doesn't go amuck, attracts early
<i>Lysimachia nummularia</i>	Creeping Jenny	Low growing, creeping, yellow flowers, summertime
<i>Lysimachia punctata</i>	Yellow Loosestrife	Spikes of yellow flowers in summer
<i>Lythrum salicaria</i>	Purple Loosestrife	Red flower spikes in late summer, a good insect attracter
<i>Veronica beccabunga</i>	Brooklime	Blue flowers, attracts bees and hoverflies
<i>Cardamine pratensis</i>	Cuckoo Flower/Lady's Smock	Pink-white flowers in springtime, foodplant of the Orange-tip butterfly
<i>Filipendula ulmaria</i>	Meadow Sweet	Spikes of white frothy flowers in late summer, good pollinator plant (already along the Dodder)
<i>Mentha aquatica</i>	Water mint	Great pollinator plant, blue flowers
<i>Geum rivale</i>	Water Avens	Pretty drooping pinky-red flowers in springtime - a great plant for bumblebees
<i>Myosotis scorpioides</i>	Water Forget-me-not	Low growing, blue flowers, early summer, attracts hoverflies and butterflies
<i>Stachys palustris</i>	Marsh Woundwort	Spikes of pink-purple flowers, all summer, great for bees

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
