



How to help your child love reading

Tip 1

Does your child love dogs? Minecraft? Football? Unicorns? Magic? Comics? You can find books about most interests at your local library.

Ask your librarian to help you find these books in your local library Find books related to your child's interests



Tip 2

Most children (and adults) love books that make them laugh. BookTrust have an amazing book finder where you can find funny books for every age. Scan below to discover some funny books and ask your local librarian to help you find them.

Make it fun - try reading books that make you laugh




Tip 3

Tip 4

You can read any time.

Why not bring a book to the dentist to read whilst you are waiting? Could you bring a book outside? How about keeping some books in the buggy or car for long journeys?

Make reading a book something you can do any time of day.

Tip 5

Don't worry if your child is only reading books by one author or only reads comics. If they enjoy it, let them read it. You can help them widen their reading choices later. For younger children, it is fine if they want to read the same book again and again for a while. Many children love the repetition and comfort of a familiar book.



MEET THE AUTHOR: CLARE LUTHER

Clare is a local author who has supported Learn to Love to Read in many ways, including author visits and book donations to our partner schools.

Why did you start writing books?

I started writing children's books when I became a mum as I wanted to create stories to help my children and me, and other families with young children, talk about our big everyday emotions.

How long does it take you to write a book?

It can really vary - some can take me a month, some can take over six months.

What is the hardest thing about writing a book?

Finding words that rhyme with each other and for them all to make sense in the story (even though it's hard work, I LOVE the challenge).

MEET THE AUTHOR: CLARE LUTHER

Which of your books that you have written is your favourite?

I'll have to choose two. 'Olive' because the dog is so brave in working through her worries and 'Wilbur' because the dog realises how important it is to show respect and be kind to others.





What books did you love to read as a child?

I really enjoyed reading 'series' of books and my three favourites were The Munch Bunch, The Garden Gang and The Worst Witch. I would visit the library, read them over and over again, copy the illustrations and then make up my own stories.

What tips or advice would you give children who want to be an author?

Never expect to write the perfect story first time; instead be patient, allow your imagination to go in all directions, be prepared to rethink a story line and have another go, and have fun with the words.
