PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Methody Collegians (*extract - published in full on the website) 16 June 2025 - AGM

It gives me great pleasure to share this brief update on the continued progress of Methody Collegians over the past year. At the heart of our efforts remains a strong commitment to building a vibrant, inclusive, and global community of former pupils who support each other and our beloved College. When I took on the role of President this time last year, I was both apprehensive and ambitious, and I am delighted that as a Council we have worked to renew our organisation, to embrace the use of technology and to engage the Collegian community.

We have made significant strides in enhancing our infrastructure, particularly through the development of our member database. This long-overdue project is already helping us reconnect with Collegians across generations and continents, strengthening the ties that bind us. Our online presence has also grown considerably, with a refreshed website and active social media channels now serving as key platforms for updates, event announcements, and engagement with alumni worldwide.

Our global membership is expanding, and we are proud of the increasing diversity and reach of our network. To help connect this broader community, we have established a new events calendar featuring a range of regular meetups, online gatherings, and College-linked celebrations. Changes to the constitution were passed at the AGM






METHODY COLLEGIANS - A NETWORK THAT REACHES AROUND THE WORLD

The College is keen to encourage alumni to sign up as mentors and kindly asks that you select MCB as the school you'd like to support.




