- 101 CHILLI PEPPERS, one pot plant, any pot size
- 102 SWEET PEPPERS, any colour, one dish of three
- 103 ONIONS, RED any variety, dressed, one dish of three
- 104 POTATOES, SALAD TYPE, one dish of five
- 105 GARLIC, one dish of three
- 106 CHILLI PEPPERS, one dish of three
- 107 SWEDES, one dish of two, tops trimmed to 75mm
- 108 SWEETCORN, one dish of two
- 109 COURGETTES, one dish of three. Max 150 mm
- 110 AUBERGINES, one dish of two
- 111 KOHL RABI, one dish of three
- 112 TOMATOES, OTHER THAN RED, one dish of 6
- 113 TOMATOES, SMALL FRUITED, one dish of six
- 114 LETTUCE, one variety, one dish of two roots washed, in jar of water
- 115 CULINARY HERBS, one jar of mixed varieties, minimum of four kinds
- 116 CABBAGES GREEN, POINTED, one dish of two guard leaves on, 50mm stalk
- 117 RHUBARB, one dish of three sticks, leaves trimmed
- 118 PEAS, MANGE TOUT, SUGAR SNAP or PURPLE PODDED, one dish of six
- 119 BEANS, FRENCH, other than green, one dish of six
- 120 TURNIPS, one dish of three, tops trimmed to 75mm

- 121 One heaviest Marrow

- 127 One heaviest Leek
- 128 One heaviest Beetroot (Beta Vulgaris) foliage removed to base of leaf stems

- **131** One heaviest Carrot foliage removed to base of all leaf stems

#### 134 A TRUG OF VEGETABLES:

A minimum six kinds of garden vegetables, mixed cultivars permitted. Staged for effect – <u>traditional style trug supplied by organiser</u>. Vegetables may extend beyond the boundary of trug but must not rest on bench. Exhibit must be suitable to be lifted and carried.

### 135 A COLLECTION OF FOUR KINDS OF VEGETABLES:

One dish of each, a min of two specimens of each kind, 16 points or under. To be staged in space 600mm frontage x 750mm deep. No backboard permitted.

#### 136 MASTER GARDENER CLASS:

A collection of flowers, fruit & vegetables, comprising:

### **SHOW RULES (GENERAL)**

- 1. The organisers can accept no responsibility for the safety of exhibits or other property. All reasonable precautions against theft or damage will be taken, but all exhibits will be staged at the owner's risk.
- 2. All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor and the cultivars should be named.
- 3. Judging of classes 101-120 to NVS guidelines. Giant Vegetable classes 121-132 to be in a sound state at time of weighing / measuring and comply with their class requirements.
- 4. Onions to be tied with natural raffia only.
- 5. Staging will be allowed between 5.00pm on Thursday 14 September until 6.30am on Friday 15 September. Only persons authorised by the Show Committee will be permitted during judging.
- 6. Exhibits must not be removed until 5.00pm on Sunday 17 September without the express permission of the Show Committee; the exhibits should be removed before 7.00pm.
- 7. All trophies to be returned to the North of England Horticultural Society one month before the next year's Show.
- 8. Only plates provided to be used.
- 9. Cabbages and cauliflowers to be shown with 76mm of stem unless stated otherwise.

#### **SHOW RULES (FRUIT SPECIFIC)**

- 10. Judging to accord with "The Horticultural Handbook," RHS 2016.
- 11. Cultivars to be named as far as possible.
- 12. Exhibits must have been cultivated by and must be the property of the exhibitor.
- 13. Dual purpose apples may be exhibited in either Class 1 or Class 2 subject to those larger than 80mm diameter to be shown as culinary, those less than this as dessert.

### **SHOW RULES (CHAMPIONSHIP CLASSES)**

- 14. Entry is free, and is restricted to one entry per entrant, per class, and must be the property of and have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 15. The Show organisers can accept no responsibility for the safety, loss or damage of exhibits or other property. All reasonable precautions will be taken, but all exhibits will be staged at owner's risk.
- 16. Exhibition quality classes will be judged to N.V.S. standards, and the judges' decisions will be final in all
- 17. Exhibits must not be removed before 5.00pm on Sunday 17 September.
- 18. All onions must be in a clean and sound condition. Bulbs that are misshapen or split will be excluded, together with onions whose bases are not firm and free of damage, whether water induced or otherwise.
- 19. The entries in classes 1 & 2 will have their roots trimmed and their tops cut using a standard gauge provided by the Show authorities. Trimming will commence at 11.30am prior to weigh-in.
- 20. Staging will be allowed between 5.00pm on Thur 14 September until 6.30am on Fri 15 September.
- 21. Exhibits will be judged from 7.00am on Friday 15 September and exhibitors must be cleared of the area by 6.45am. The "weigh-in" of classes 1 & 2 will take place at 12 noon the same day.
