SHOW RULES

1. All vegetable exhibits to be judged under NVS rules.
2. All exhibits to have been grown by the exhibitor. *2 or more persons may not compete separately in the same class with produce from the same garden or allotment.* If members of a household wish to share the credit and the prizes, then the exhibits must be entered in joint names.
3. For the benefit of visitors and fellow exhibitors all varieties should be named wherever possible.
4. All entries must be made to the Show Manager (with correct entry fee) before, and no later than, 11.00 am on entry to the staging area on the day of the show. Entry fees are stated overleaf. Note restrictions Class 7 and Class 38.
5. Entries staged by 1 exhibitor are limited to 2 per class, **except for Classes 7, and 29 to 37 which are 1 entry only.**
6. Entries must be staged between 9.00 am and 11.00 am on the day of the show.
7. No exhibits may be removed until after the end of the show at 3.30 pm.
8. Objections must be made in writing to the show manager before 2.00 pm accompanied by a deposit of £1.00 which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
9. The judges' decisions are final (except for Rule 8).
10. Any person showing exhibits in his/her own name but belonging to another person will forfeit all claims to prizes which may have been won. The committee may bar such a person from future EYDA shows.
11. The NVS and its officers can accept no responsibility for loss or damage to an exhibitor's property, howsoever caused. However, all reasonable precautions will be taken to prevent loss or damage.
12. By entering the show an exhibitor agrees to be bound by the rules. In the case of dispute the decision of the EYDA Show Manager will be final.
13. Points are awarded as follows:-

1 st	3 points
2 nd	2 points
3 rd	1 point

In the event of a tie the number of 1st places will count.

14. **Only paid up members of the NVS may enter Class 7.** This class is for the NVS Plaque.

SCHEDULE OF CLASSES

- 1 **East Yorkshire Onion Championship** for 3 dressed onions, each onion to exceed 1kg.
- 2 **East Yorkshire DA Top Tray** for Collection of 5 kinds of vegetables, 1 of each kind. To be laid flat on the table.
- 3 **Collection of 3 kinds of vegetables**, 2 of each kind. To be laid flat on the table.
- 4 **Potatoes**: 2 dishes of 4. 1 white variety: 1 non-white variety.
- 5 **Potatoes** – white variety. 1 dish of 5.
- 6 **Potatoes** – other than white variety. 1 dish of 5.
- 7 ***Onions** – each onion **not to exceed 250 gm**. 1 dish of 5. NVS PLAQUE CLASS.
This class is open to paid-up members of the NVS only.
- 8 **Onions** – each onion **to exceed 250 gm but not to exceed 1 kg**. 1 dish of 3.
- 9 **Parsnips**: 1 dish of 2. Tops trimmed to approximately 75 mm.
- 10 **Carrots** – long pointed variety. 1 dish of 2. Tops trimmed to approximately 75 mm.
- 11 **Carrots** – stump rooted variety. 1 dish of 3. Tops trimmed to approximately 75 mm.
- 12 **Globe Beetroot**: 1 dish of 3. Tops trimmed to approximately 75 mm.
- 13 **Tap Root Collection**: 1 of each kind from 3 of the following: Parsnip, Carrot (long pointed), Carrot (stump rooted), Beetroot.
- 14 **Tomatoes**: medium variety. 1 dish of 5.
- 15 **Tomatoes**: small-fruited variety. 1 dish of 7.
- 16 **Cucumbers**: 1 dish of 1.
- 17 **Runner Beans**: 1 dish of 6.
- 18 **Cauliflower**: 1 dish of 1. Root trimmed to approximately 50 mm.
- 19 **Marrows**: 1 dish of 2.
- 20 **Shallots (small)**: 1 dish of 9. Each shallot to pass through NVS 30 mm ring.
- 21 **Shallots** – large/exhibition. 1 dish of 6.
- 22 **Leeks**: 1 dish of 2.
- 23 **Any other vegetable not specified in classes 1-22**. 1 dish of 1.
- 24 **1 vegetable and 1 flowering stem**.
- 25 **An arrangement** of 1 vase of flowers and 3 vegetable exhibits to be chosen from the following list:- Gladioli 2, Dahlias 3 (any kind), Chrysanthemums 3 (any kind), Carnations 3, Roses 3 stems, Cauliflower 1 (50 mm root), Onions – dressed 3, Potatoes 5 (1 variety), Tomatoes 5, Stump rooted Carrots 3, Beetroot 3, Shallots 6.
- 26 **Rose**: 1 vase of 1 stem.
- 27 **Gladioli**: 1 vase of 1.
- 28 **A Vase of Mixed Cut Flowers**.

Novice Classes (29 – 37)

- 29 Cabbage: 1 dish of 1.
- 30 *Potatoes: 1 dish of 4.
- 31 Carrots: 1 dish of 3
- 32 Tomatoes: medium variety. 1 dish of 4.
- 33 Cucumber: 1 dish of 1.
- 34 Leeks: 1 dish of 2.
- 35 *Collection of 3 kinds of vegetables – 1 of each kind. To be laid flat on the table.
- 36 Dressed Onions: 1 dish of 3.
- 37 1 vegetable and 1 flowering stem.

Other classes

- 38 *A Basket of Vegetables – maximum size of basket 50 cm x 30 cm. Class 38 is only open to members who attend our monthly meetings.
- 39 Apples – dessert variety. 1 dish of 4.
- 40 Apples – culinary variety. 1 dish of 4.
