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RULES

- ENTRIES are cordially welcomed at 35p per entry. Only one entry allowed per Class and only one named Exhibitor to compete in any given Class. Note: Competitors will be provided with a pass giving free admission to the show.
- 2. STAGING The Hall will be open on Friday night from 7.00pm to 9.00pm and on Saturday from 8.00am and all articles intended for competition must be staged by 10.30am on the day of Exhibition and can only be removed after its close at 4.30pm. The Society provides vases for staging Cut Spikes of Flowers, but in the staging of Cut Blooms in Classes where Boards and Bowls are specified, they must be provided by the Exhibitor. Each article staged must have an entry card, which will be provided at the Hall.
- 3. No Competitor will be allowed to remove exhibits from the tables before the close of the Exhibition.
- 4. All Cups and Trophies are the property of the Society, and cannot be won outright. They should be handed in to W.J. Blair, The Square, Kelso for engraving.
- 5. Prize Money will be paid in the Secretary's Office between 2.30pm and 3.45pm on day of show.
- 6. Prize Money not claimed on the day of the Show will be returned to the Society's funds.
- Points will be awarded as follows:–
 First (3 points); Second (2 points); Third (1 point); Fourth (1/2 point).

 For any cup or trophy where points gained result in a tie, the exhibitor with the most first prizes will be adjudged the winner.
- 8. The Society cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
- 9. Experienced persons will be appointed Judges, who shall have power to withhold prizes when articles are not considered to be of sufficient merit. In all cases their decisions shall be final.
- 10. Handicraft exhibits must be the work of the Exhibitor and Must Not Have Been Exhibited at a previous show.

ACCESSORY is any figure, ornament, drape, etc. used to enhance the artistic value of an arrangement.

Note: NO ARTIFICIAL DYED or surface coloured plant material may be used.

SPACE: No part of an arrangement may extend beyond the given space, or touch the sides of a niche. The exhibit may be penalised for being either too large or too small for the space allowed.

ARRANGEMENT: This should be of any natural plant material in any container, with or without base.

COMPOSITION: Arrangement, or more than one arrangement, of any natural plant material with one or more accessories.

AN EXHIBIT: Allows the use of drapes, bases and other accessories.

RECIPE – STICKY DATE CAKE

Ingredients:

200g Dried Dates, chopped 275ml Boiling Water 1 tsp Bicarbonate of Soda 175g Soft Brown Sugar 150g Butter, room temperature 3 Eggs, beaten 175g Self raising Flour

Method:

Pour the boiling water over three quarters of the dates and leave to soak for 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 175°C. Blend together the butter, sugar and soaked dates, including the soaking water. Add the eggs and stir in the flour and bicarbonate of soda. Finally stir in the remaining dates. Pour into a 30cm square lined tin. Bake for 40 minutes until firm to the touch.

CROCHET PATTERN - CHOCOLATE CHRISTMAS PUDDING

Using cream 6dc magic ring.

Row 2, 2dc in each stitch (12).

Row 3. 1dc in next dc 2dc in next repeat to end (18).

Row 4. 1dc in each next 2 stitches 2dc in next repeat to end (24).

Row 5. 1dc in each next 3 stitches 2dc in next repeat to end (30).

Row 6. 1dc in each next 4 stitches 2dc in next repeat to end (36).

Row 7, 8 and 9: 1dc in each stitch without increases.

Shell row: Work front loop only *dc in stitch miss 2 stitches 6tr shell in next stitch miss 2 stitches repeat from * to end slip stitch in to first dc (6 \times shells).

Change to brown.

Row 1. work back loops only 1dc in each stitch.

Row 2-8. 1dc in each to end.

Sheering elastic for bottom.

3 green felt holly leaves and one red button or red felt berry for the top.
