Dear Exhibitor

Following the successful introduction of the Horticulture Village at the Show last year, we will be continuing to build on this and will welcome the Welsh National Honey Show and Food Sense Wales' work promoting healthy eating at schools with edible gardens and cookery demonstrations.

The village will continue to celebrate all aspects of horticulture in Wales – from community to commercial growing, competitive showing and displays; alongside promoting the health and social benefits of gardening. The ethos is to 'inspire, educate and collaborate.' And it will create an opportunity to collaborate through inclusive social spaces, meeting areas and demonstration stages.

The competitive element will be housed in the same location as last year however within an adjoining L shaped marquee which can be accessed internally or via the external pathways. The Garddle (general competitions, children's activities, trade stands) area will continue to flow into the Eisteddfodau (Floral Art, workshop and trade stand) area and this has been extended by 15m by 15m to include the Farchnad, a selling space for Welsh Growers.

Entries will be made via the online entry system which is convenient and easy to use without the additional work and cost with postage and a secure way to pay. We will continue with the option of doing this via the traditional postal entry system for those who do not have suitable connectivity (please get in touch for further information).

- ◆ The Garddle Marquee will be open for the reception of exhibits from 2.00pm on Sunday 20 July until 11.00pm and additionally from 6.00am until 7.00am on Monday 21 July for 2025.
- ◆ Exhibitors are allowed to enter **two exhibits** in every class.
- ◆ In order to encourage and improve participation in the general competitive Horticulture Section, (**excluding the Junior Section**), the Society has agreed to provide one admission ticket (any day) per exhibitor for a two year experimental period only. The results of this will be keenly recorded and monitored. Admission tickets will only be allocated by the Chief Steward on presentation of the entries on the Sunday or Monday morning.

Your name and county will be published within the Society's catalogue. Results will also be circulated with members of the press and published on our website. We retain your data in accordance with our retention schedule to simplify future applications. You have various rights in the data we hold including rectification and objecting to processing. Please also be aware that photographs and film will be taken throughout the Showground for broadcast, publicity and marketing purposes.**
- 2. Please note that if the exhibitor is under 18 years of age then the online entry has to be completed by a parent/guardian who is over 18 years of age. Please note that whoever completes the entry form takes full responsibility for complying with all rules and regulations.**

- 1. The Garddle Marquee will be open for the reception of amateur exhibits from 2.00pm until 11.00pm on Sunday 20 July 2025 and additionally from 6.00am until 7.00am on Monday 21 July 2025. In order to prevent hurry and confusion on the Show Day, you are strongly urged to deliver and stage your exhibits no later than Sunday 20 July, but all exhibits must be in the Marquee and staged by 7.00am on Monday 21 July 2025.**
- 2. No amateur exhibit may be removed before 5pm on Thursday 24 July 2025. Access arrangements for amateur section exhibitors to remove their exhibits will be included with their admission package.**
- 3. Exhibitors are not allowed to bring their dogs into the Marquee.**

4. Pot sizes are only limited where indicated in the schedule. Where no indication is given the size should be in proportion to the plant. The diameter of a pot is the inside measurement made as near to the top as possible.
5. All plants and produce should be grown by the exhibitor.
6. **Closing date of entries for all sections is Wednesday 25 June 2025.**
For confirmation that your entries have been received, please contact us up until the closing date of entries.
7. Judging will commence at 7.30am prompt on **Monday 21 July 2025**. Any exhibit not properly staged at that hour may be disqualified. The Marquee will be cleared during judging and no one but Judges and Officials in attendance will be allowed in the Marquee until the judging is completed.
Garddle Marquee will be open to the public from 10.30am or such time as the judging duties have been completed.
8. All exhibits must be free standing. No exhibit should be fixed to any part of the staging provided. This rule may be overruled by the Chief Steward if there is an issue of safety to the public.
9. ***The judges' decision shall be final. The judge of any class in the amateur schedule, may refuse to judge an exhibit deemed not to be of a quality which might reasonably be expected of an exhibit at a National Show. Entries in future years, by such an exhibitor, will not be accepted in the amateur section.***
All judges reserve the right to advise the stewards to remove exhibits which are markedly poor and reflects badly on the standard of a National Show.
10. Exhibitors are requested to make all necessary renewals of cut blooms before 9.00am on any day after the first day of the Show.
11. A protest must be made in writing and handed to the Chief Steward within half an hour of completion of judging, together with a deposit of £25.00 which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
A panel consisting of the Chief Steward, Head of Administration and one other Horticulture Steward has been put in place to act on removing any poor exhibits, dealing with any protest etc.
12. The Society reserves to itself, by its Board of Directors, the sole and absolute right to interpret these or any other prescribed conditions and regulations, or prize sheets, and to settle and determine all matters, questions or differences in regard there to, or otherwise arising out of or connected with or incidental to the Show as it sees fit.
13. No responsibility will be accepted by the Society for loss or damage to exhibits (or any portion thereof) or personal belongings before, during or after the event, nor will the Society be responsible for the loss of any plant, flower or receptacle in transit to or from or on the showground, during or after the event.
14. A Steward will be on duty in the Marquee until 11.00pm on **Sunday 20 July 2025**, after which time emergency contact can be made via the Medical Centre on 01982 551057 or Show Control on 01982 551270. Security staff are contactable at the Machinery Entrance 24 hours a day. A guard will be on patrol during Show evenings and overnight.

15. **During staging times in the Amateur Section, exhibitors and officials only may remain.**
16. **Points awarded on the basis of: 1st – 3, 2nd – 2, 3rd – 1.**
17. **A Rosette will be awarded to each first prize winner in all the amateur sections.**
18. **For 2025, TWO exhibits from one exhibitor in any one class has been allowed.**
19. **The Society reserves the right to cancel any class which are low in entries.**
20. **In order to comply with the Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy Order 1996 it is essential that no meat or bonemeal products are used in the Horticulture section.**
21. **Any waste created during staging should either preferably be taken home by the exhibitor or placed in the relevant recycling waste bins for collection in Avenue A.**
22. **It would be appreciated if the Society office could be informed of non ability to exhibit in any classes as soon as possible prior to the show.**
23. **Prize cards and rosettes not collected during the Show will only be posted to exhibitors who contact the office within 6 weeks following the event.**

National Sweet Pea Championship of Wales

1. **Two or more persons may not exhibit separately from the same garden, nursery or plant house (except for junior exhibitors).**
2. **All vases of Sweet Peas exhibited must be correctly and legibly named on white card. Cultivars not in commerce must be labelled 'seedling' until all judging has been completed and the name of the cultivar may then be added to the card if desired.**
3. **The use of wire or other support attached to the flowers, or spikes, or the exhibiting of spikes with haulm attached will disqualify. Reeds, grass and other materials used in vases to facilitate staging arrangements must NOT appear above the rim of the vase and all Sweet Peas in the vase classes must be shown in NSPS type vases as supplied by the RWAS. Bowls/baskets/saucers also provided.**
4. **Stems of all cut flowers to be in water retaining material.**
5. **The NSPS colour list is available to exhibitors from the office on request.**

The Royal Welsh Top Vase class rules

1. **The Royal Welsh Top Vase class is for a vase of mixed flowering stems of any flowering plant containing a total of between five and ten stems, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Please note that it is two different kinds of plants; two varieties of the same plant are NOT two kinds.**
2. **The display will be judged out of a total of 35 points, split into: 25 points for floral quality, and 10 points for the overall presentation. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of the flowers should be to normal rules used for other classes.**

3. Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only; no seed heads or berries will be allowed.

Notes for exhibitors and judges

- Flowering stems can be taken from ANY flowering plant.
- The different kinds of plants need to be taken from different genera. For instance, pinks, carnations and Sweet William – which are all dianthus – would not be classed as different kinds.
- The Royal Welsh Top Vase class is open for anyone to enter and is not intended purely for growers who regularly display single species classes at shows.
- The points awarded should be clearly marked by the judge on the exhibitors' cards.

Vegetable & Soft Fruit

1. All varieties to be named.
2. No exhibit to be removed or changed subsequent to judging.
3. Two entries per exhibitor are allowed in each class.
4. A plate not to exceed 25cm.
