FLOWERS & PLANTS

Entry Fee: €3 unless otherwise stated.

Class HO1: 1 Stem of HT Rose

Class HO2: 3 Stems of Floribunda Roses

Description: Any colours

Class HO3: Vase of Mixed Garden Flowers

Class HO4: 4 Stems of Hosta

Description: 2 different varieties

Class H05: 6 Stems Herbaceous Flowers

Description: Mixed Varieties

Class HO6: 3 Stems of Conifer

Description: Different varieties

Class H07: 3 Stems of Variegated Shrub Foliage

Description: Different varieties

Class HO8: 3 Succulents

Description: Different varieties, displayed on a plate, plate not to exceed 23cm

Class HO9: Indoor Flowering Pot Plant

Description: Pot not to exceed 23 cm

Class HO10: Window Box

Description: Not to exceed 75cm in length.

FARM PRODUCE

Entry Fee: €3 unless otherwise stated.

Class HO11: Best Sample of Sod Suitable for Pasture $_{\rm 1ft\,\times\,1ft}$

Class HO12: Best Sample of Hay

Description: Neatly tied.

CHILDREN'S CLASSES (U18)

Entry Fee: €2 unless otherwise stated.

Class HO13: Mr Potato Head Creation

Go wild! Can be displayed on a paper plate (provided if required).

Class HO14: 2 of Any Vegetable or Fruit

Description: Best sample of 2 of any 1 kind of vegetable or fruit. To be displayed on a paper plate.

Rules and conditions under 'Fruit and Vegetables' category apply.

FRUIT & VEGETABLES

Entry Fee: €3 unless otherwise stated.

RULES AND CONDITIONS:

- 1. All vegetables should be washed and free from soil with roots trimmed as required.
- 2. Vegetable classes will be judged according to the National Vegetable Society's rules.
- 3. Paper plates provided where required.
- 4. Presentation will be considered by the judge.

Class HO15: 2 Courgettes

Description: 1 dish of 2 to be displayed on a paper plate. Approx. 150mm in length.

Class HO16: Beans, 6 pods

Description: 1 dish of 6 pods to be displayed on a paper plate. Any variety.

Class HO17: 2 Heads of Cabbage

Description: To be displayed flat on the table with approx. 75mm of stalk.

Class HO18: 3 Onions

Description: 1 dish of 3 to be displayed flat on the table. Greens attached and roots trimmed.

Class HO19: 3 Bulbs of Garlic

Description: 1 dish of 3 bulbs with approx. 75mm of stem. To be displayed on a paper plate.

Class HO20: 2 Heads of Lettuce

Description: 1 dish of 2. To be displayed flat on the table.

Class HO21: 6 Culinary Herbs

Description: Collection of 6 kinds of culinary herbs, varieties must be named. Exhibitor to provide water and container.

Class HO22: 3 Potatoes

Description: 1 dish of 3 to be d isplayed on paper plate. Variety to be named.

Class HO23: 2 of Any Vegetable Not Already Classed

Description: Best sample of 2 of 1 kind of vegetable not already classed. To be displayed on a paper plate.

Class HO24: Basket/ container of Homegrown Vegetables

Description: Mixed cultivars permitted. Exhibitor to provide container or basket.

Class HO25: 10 Gooseberries

Description: Any cultivar, 1 dish of 10 to be displayed on a paper plate.

Class HO26: 10 Strawberries

Description: 1 dish of 10, with calyx, to be displayed on a paper plate.

Class HO27: 3 Stalks of Rhubarb

Description: 3 sticks to be displayed flat on the table. Leaf blades to be trimmed back to approximately 75mm.

Class HO28: Any dish of fruit (1 kind) not already classed

Description: To be displayed on a paper plate (provided if required).

Class HO29: Basket/ container of at least 3 kinds of fruit

Description: Mixed cultivars permitted. To be staged for effect. Exhibitor to provide basket/ container.

Class HO30: Best in Show Fruit and Vegetables

Description: Best of individual fruit and vegetable classes, including U18 classes.

Winner will be awarded a boxed rosette and National Vegetable Society medal and prize card.

Champion Class - no direct entry. Qual. Classes: Prizes: 1st - Best in Show Fruit and Vegetables

Class HO40: Allotment Competition Class Confined to Allotment or Community Garden Groups

Each exhibit must consist of a display of fruit, vegetables, herbs, flowers, and produce from an allotment or community garden. The exhibit should be displayed within an area not larger than 610mm x 610mm (24"x24").

Condition and quality: 50 points

Overall presentation and attractiveness: 25 points

Class HO31Q: The Quality Onion All Ireland Championship THE QUALITY ONION ALL IRELAND CHAMPIONSHIP

RULES AND CONDITIONS

- 1. In this competition, the produce must be the property of and grown by the exhibitor.
- 2. Each exhibit is to consist of the following:

A dish of 5 onions of any variety.

- 3. The onions may be grown from either seed or sets.
- 4. The onions may be Autumn or Spring sown. The variety to be correctly named.
- 5. Each onion must be tied and weigh not more than 450grams.
- 6. The onions to be harvested and have clear unbroken skins.
- 7. A special qualifying class will be held at selected shows. Two exhibits may qualify for the Final, if the Judges agree that the standard is high enough.
- 8. An exhibitor can only qualify one exhibit for the All-Ireland final.

Each of the successful qualifiers will receive a memento on appearance at the Final

The Competition will be judged as follows: Condition / Quality: 25 points, Uniformity and Shape: 25 points Size / Weight: 10 points, Colour: 10 point Overall presentation / attractiveness: 10 points Judge's decision will be final at all stages of the competition. Exhibits are displayed at owner's risk. These rules should be read in conjunction with the I.S.A. Rules.

- 1. This competition is to encourage growers to exhibit produce from their own kitchen garden
- 2. In this competition the produce should be the property of and be grown by the exhibitor.
- 3. Each exhibit must consist of a display of fruit and vegetables excluding potatoes.
- 4. Not fewer than 7 kinds
- 5. Not more than 10. Foliage and root growth may be trimmed for display purposes and herbs may

be included

- 6. The veg and fruit should be displayed within area not larger than 610mm x 610mm (24"x24") and height not exceeding 90cm (3ft)
- 7. However, foliage and roots may extend beyond that boundary but not rest on the show bench.
- 8. Marquee open from 7.30am on show morning and will be closed for judging at 10am sharp.
- Marquee will open to the public at 12 noon.
- 9. Exhibits cannot be removed before 5.00pm.
- 10. An exhibitor can only qualify one exhibit for the All-Ireland final.

- Each exhibit is to consist of the following: A dish of 6 potatoes of any variety. The variety to be correctly named. Each tuber should be free from skin blemishes, be true to type, and weigh approximately 6 ozs. (170g).
- 3. Two exhibits to qualify at each show.
- 4. This being a quality championship, the adjudicators will favour floury, high dry matter varieties, which are popular with the Irish customer.
- 5. These rules should be read in conjunction with the Irish Shows Association Rules.
- Marquee open from 7.30am on show morning and will be closed for judging at 10 am sharp. Marquee will open to the public at 12 noon.
- 7. Exhibits cannot be removed before 5.00pm.
