RULES

- ENTRIES are cordially welcomed at 35p per entry. Only one entry allowed per Class and only one named Exhibitor to compete in any given Class. Note: Competitors will be provided with a pass giving free admission to the show.
- 2. STAGING The Hall will be open on Saturday night from 7.00pm to 9.00pm and on Sunday from 8.00am and all articles intended for competition must be staged by 10.30am on the day of Exhibition and can only be removed after its close at 4.30pm. The Society provides vases for staging Cut Spikes of Flowers, but in the staging of Cut Blooms in Classes where Boards and Bowls are specified, they must be provided by the Exhibitor. Each article staged must have an entry card, which will be provided at the Hall.
- 3. No Competitor will be allowed to remove exhibits from the tables before the close of the Exhibition.
- 4. All Cups and Trophies are the property of the Society, and cannot be won outright. They should be handed in to W.J. Blair, The Square, Kelso for engraving.
- 5. Prize Money will be paid in the Secretary's Office between 2.30pm and 3.45pm on day of show.
- 6. Prize Money not claimed on the day of the Show will be returned to the Society's funds.
- Points will be awarded as follows:–
 First (3 points); Second (2 points); Third (1 point); Fourth (1/2 point).

 For any cup or trophy where points gained result in a tie, the exhibitor with the most first prizes will be adjudged the winner.
- 8. The Society cannot be held responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
- 9. Experienced persons will be appointed Judges, who shall have power to withhold prizes when articles are not considered to be of sufficient merit. In all cases their decisions shall be final.
- 10. Handicraft exhibits must be the work of the Exhibitor and Must Not Have Been Exhibited at a previous show.

RECIPE - SPECULOOS BISCUIT CAKE

A Trophy for Best Exhibit in Classes 240 - 242

Ingredients:

For the cake

140g (5 oz) Soft Margarine (or butter at room temperature), plus extra for greasing

125g (4 1/2 oz) Speculoos biscuits (approx 16 biscuits)

240g (8 3/4 oz) Speculoos spread

120g (4 1/2 oz) soft light brown sugar

140g (5 oz) self-raising flour

1tsp Baking powder

4 free-range eggs

3 tbsp Greek-style yoghurt

For the buttercream

150g (5 ½oz) butter at room temperature

250g (9 oz) icing sugar, sieved

100g (3 ½oz) smooth Speculoos spread

Method:

 $Preheat \ oven \ to \ 160^{\circ}C/140^{\circ}C \ Fan/Gas \ 2\%. \ Grease \ two \ 20cm/8 in \ sandwich \ cake \ tins \ and \ line \ bases \ with \ baking \ paper.$

Blend the biscuits in a food processor to make a very fine crumb.

Beat together the speculoos spread, margarine, sugar, flour, baking powder, eggs, yoghurt and 100g (3 ½oz) of the biscuit crumbs in a stand mixer or with an electric whisk.

Start on a low speed until all the ingredients are combined, then increase to a high speed and beat until the mixture is pale and fluffy. Set aside the remaining biscuit crumb for decoration.

Divide the mixture between the two tins and bake for 30-35 minutes, or until a skewer inserted into the middle of the cake comes out clean. Leave the cakes to cool slightly before transferring from the tins to a wire rack to cool completely.

To make the butter cream, beat the butter until soft and smooth. Gradually add the icing sugar, a spoonful at a time. Once all of the icing sugar is added, beat until light and fluffy. Add the speculoos spread and beat again until combined.

 $Spread\ two\ thirds\ of\ the\ buttercream\ on\ top\ of\ one\ of\ the\ cooled\ sponges\ and\ top\ with\ the\ other\ sponge.$

Spread the remaining buttercream on the top in a swirl pattern. Sprinkle with the remaining biscuit crumb.
