In his informative and entertaining presentation, Medwyn will share insights from his remarkable journey from early beginnings to becoming a National Champion.

Whether you're a beginner gardener or a seasoned grower, this talk will take you through the full growing journey from selecting varieties and sowing seeds to training, feeding, and preparing blooms for exhibition.

Alongside expert tips and real-world advice, Sarah includes personal insights, lessons learned, and plenty of encouragement to help you succeed with your own sweet peas.

Sarah will bring a selection of sweet pea seeds available for purchase after the event, ideal for anyone feeling inspired to start growing right away.

Join Sean Egan as he shares his journey and expertise in growing prize-winning onions from his garden located in Kerry, Southwest Ireland. From mastering the art of cultivating onions from seeds and sets to producing perfectly sized bulbs under 250g and under 450g, Sean along with his wife Teresa, have achieved top results, including winning the All-Ireland Quality Onion Championship in 2023 2024 and 2025.

In this talk, Sean will explain his growing methods, the unique conditions of his local climate, and tips for preparing onions for show. Sean will also provide an insider's look into how the Irish agricultural show system work, from local qualifications to the prestigious All-Ireland final and what judges look for in a champion onion.

'Building Soil Resilience' will look at how to future proof your soil in a changing climate where we may experience droughts alternating with heavy rain. We will look at the various elements of a healthy soil such as soil life, structure, organic matter and how to assess them using basic resources. We will then examine the various ways that you can boost soil health using a range of sustainable inputs, no dig or minimal tillage and green manures and cover crops.

Anton Rosenfeld is research manager at Garden Organic. His work has ranged from projects with commercial field-scale

growers to small-scale community gardens and allotments. Currently he manages their citizen science programme, runs training courses for the public and community groups and writes regularly for Kitchen Garden Magazine. He has a passion for soils and composting and has also built a seed collection and resources for growing multicultural crops.
