SHOW REGULATIONS

ENTRIES: All classes are open unless otherwise stated.

- All entries must be on the official entry form, which should be returned to the Show Secretary. Photocopies will be accepted.
- Closing Dates: Entries will be accepted up to midnight on Friday 19th September and between 6am and 7.30am on Saturday 20th September. THE HALL IS CLOSED FROM MIDNIGHT ON FRIDAY TO 5AM ON SATURDAY.
- 3 Late Entries: Will only be accepted at the discretion of the Secretary.
- 4 Entry to all classes is free but a registration fee of £3 will be levied on all exhibitors, except for those who are 16 years pf age or under..
- 5 Only one entry is allowed per exhibitor in each class unless otherwise stated.
- 6 Each exhibitor is held to declare that the subjects exhibited by them are of their own growing and have been in their possession at least two months prior to the date of the Show, (excluding Floral Art). Any infringement of this rule will disqualify the exhibitor and all prizes will be forfeited.
- 7 Sizes of pots, trays etc relate to the internal measurement.

STAGING:

- 1 Staging hours: 11am Friday til midnight on Friday 19th September and from 5am to 7:30am on Saturday 20th September.
- 2 Exhibitors must report to the registration desk within the venue.
- 3 Staging Cards: Exhibitors must satisfy themselves that the staging cards are correct and fully completed with their exhibitor number, name and address. Any exhibit in the competition classes staged without the appropriate card may be disqualified.
- 4 The Show Committee will supply exhibitors with vases, plates and staging cards.
- 5 Committee members and stewards will be in attendance during staging and removal times, and stewards may assist in the placing and removal of exhibits.
- The Show Committee may refuse any exhibit which they consider detrimental to the Show.
- A clear passage must be kept at all times during the hours of staging.
- 8 Committee Members and Stewards have the authority to move exhibits if required.

JUDGING

- All competitors must have their exhibits staged by 7.30am on the first morning of the show and all persons not directly involved with the judging (except persons authorised by the Secretary) must leave at that time.
- Judging in the Chrysanthemum, Dahlia and Vegetable Sections will be conducted under the current National Chrysanthemum Society Rules, National Dahlia Classified List & Rules and the National Vegetable Society Rules for judging.
- 3 Immediately the show areas are cleared, the judges will proceed to make the awards.
- The decision of the judges is final as to the relative merits of the exhibit and they have powers to withhold or modify prizes where the exhibits are not worthy of an award.
- For prizes on points: 1st 4 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point unless otherwise stated. In the event of a tie for prizes awarded on the basis of most points, the winner will be decided on most firsts, most seconds and if required, on most thirds.
- 6 All vegetables must be clean, sound and properly dressed. Undue dressing may disqualify.

PROTESTS

1. Any protest must be lodged by the exhibitor and with the Secretary in writing before 4pm on the first day of the show along with a payment of £5 refundable only if the complaint is upheld by the Committee. Any decision reached by the Show Committee on all matters arising under this schedule and regulations will be final.

REMOVALS

- 1 The Show will close immediately after the presentation of prizes on the Sunday.
- The Secretary will announce the procedure for removing exhibits from the Show after the presentation of prizes.
- Any items remaining, unless a late collection has been pre-arranged, shall become the property of the Show Committee and may be sold in aid of Show Funds after that time.

LIABILITY FOR LOSS

The organising societies and organisations, their officers and committee members will not be held liable for any loss or damage done to plants, flowers, vegetables, stands or other articles while in exhibition but all reasonable care will be taken of them.

PROPERTY OF CUPS

All cups, trophies and shields are the property of the various societies and organisations running the show and unless specifically stated, cannot be won outright.

PRIZE MONEY

Prize money will be paid at the show office at the venue between 11.30am and 4pm on the Sunday of the Show. Prize money may be collected on the Saturday once the results have been finalised, if exhibitors will not be present on the Sunday. Postal applications may be made to the Show Secretary who will remit money less costs such as postage. Applications must be made within one week of the closing of the Show.

OTHER

For the purpose of this schedule, please note the following:

- "kind" a term which is used in the classification of plants, flowers, fruits and vegetables for show purposes, e.g. Chrysanthemums, delphiniums, phloxes and roses are kinds of flowers. Apples, grapes, peaches, pears and plums are kinds of fruit. Asparagus, carrot, onion, peas are kinds of vegetables. With plants and flowers, kinds usually roughly correspond to genera.
- "cultivar" the internationally accepted term for what is commonly known by horticulturists as a cultivated variety which are variants of species or hybrids produced by man in cultivation, e.g. Rose "Peace", Gladioli "Peter Pears", Sweet Pea "Chatsworth".
- Any irregularities not catered for in these regulations shall be referred to the Fife Flower Show Committee whose decision shall be final.
- 4 Entries and communications relating to the show must be addressed to the show secretary.
- Each exhibitor shall be asked to sign a declaration on the entry form to allow the Fife Flower Show secretary to record your details for the sole purpose of the Show in accordance with new Protection Laws. Personal details shall not be passed on to any third party

EXHIBITOR NOTES

- 1 When exhibits are staged, labels will be issued by show staff. Nothing other than official class number labels may be on any part of an exhibit except in classes 265 & 266.
- Official class number labels to be fixed to jars ½" from base; on the short side of cut comb cases; top right of show case and frames of honey; on the bottom right of displays.
- 3 Frames of honey to be displayed in a frame case with glass/plastic sides.
- 4 Extracted honey must be exhibited in plain, straight sided clear 227g, 340g or 454g jars with plain lids (gold lacquered metal, gold or white plastic, screw or twist lids) except where stated otherwise.
- 5 In all 2 jar classes the jars and honey to be identical.
- 6 Displays restricted to a maximum area of 45cm x 45cm (1'6" x 1'6").
- 7 Classes 265 and 266. Retail sales regulations apply.
- 8 Class 265. Honey not exceed 5.5kg (12lb). To be judged on sales appeal. Accessories and any type of jar may be used.
- 9 Class 266. All jars and honey to be identical in all respects
- 10. Honey must be produced by exhibitors' own bees.
- 11 An exhibitor may enter a maximum of 3 entries in each class but can only be awarded one prize.
- A novice is permitted to win 1st prize in a novice class 3 times before he/she can no longer be considered a novice. (this only applies to the Fife Open Honey Show and is to encourage more new bee keepers to enter). However, any novice winning 1st prize in an open class in any SBA or Nationally recognized Honey Show, even though they have not yet won 3 x 1st prizes in the novice classes at the Fife Show, will no longer be eligible to enter the novice classes.
- 13 The Honey Judge has the right to cancel any class which, in their opinion, does not reach a satisfactory standard.
- 14. The Honey Judge's decision is final.
