Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of the National Vegetable Society

1. Accounting Policies

The principal accounting policies adopted, judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty in the preparation of the financial statements are as follows:

- a) Basis of preparation: The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s).
- b) Income and expenditure: Income is brought into the financial statements when received. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. Unrestricted funds are available to spend on activities that further any of the purposes of charity. Designated funds are unrestricted funds of the charity which the trustees have decided at their discretion to set aside to use for a specific purpose. Restricted funds are donations which the donor has specified are to be solely used for particular areas of the society's work or for specific projects being undertaken by the society.
- c) Subscriptions: Subscriptions are recognized when received.
- d) Fixed assets: This comprises only an item of sound equipment and trophies.
- e) Stock: Stock is included at the lower of cost or net realisable value. Donated items of stock are recognised on receipt at fair value which is the amount the charity would have been willing to pay for the items on the open market.

2. Transactions with Members of the National Executive

No trustee or person defined by accounting standards as "related to them" received any remuneration for services as a trustee or in a management capacity during the year, or for any reimbursement of expenses other than for expenditure incurred as an agent of the society. Travel to the National Executive meetings was reimbursed to those trustees who claimed it.

3. Shows and Events

These comprise the National Championships of the NVS, the Regional Branch Championships, local championships by District Association, and other events with lectures, members' information and social evenings and exhibitions. Incidental fundraising activities at these events (eg. Raffles) are treated as events revenues.

4. Members Magazines etc

Each member receives a quarterly magazine with information and advice on the cultivation of vegetables, together with news of the events involving vegetable cultivation and exhibition in their Regional Branch and District Association.
