Exhibits in class 19L entered in the Societies/Groups/Club name, must similarly have been grown by the Society/Groups/Club members.
- 2. Entry forms must reach the Show Secretary by Thursday, 15 September 2022. No late entries will be accepted.
- 3. ONLY ONE ENTRY FROM EACH ADDRESS PER CLASS ALLOWED, other than in the Rose section, where two entries per class are permitted.
- The Harvest Pavilion will be open from Noon on Thursday, 22 September 2022 until 6.30am on Friday 23 for exhibitors to stage. Security staff will be in attendance throughout the night. However, stewards will only be on duty during the following times to give advice and issue exhibit cards on Thursday, 22 September noon to 10.00pm, Friday, 23 September 2022, 6.00am to 6.30am. The Harvest Pavilion will be electrically illuminated throughout the night. All exhibitors must leave the Marquee by 6.30am. Judging will commence at 7.00am.
 PLEASE NOTE THE HARVEST PAVILION IS LOCATED BY THE YELLOW GATE NORTH END OF THE SHOWGROUND.
- 5. Exhibits should be NAMED where possible for the interest and education of onlookers. All exhibits in Alpine classes **must** be named. Variety cards will be available from the Stewards.
- 6. **VASES WILL BE AVAILABLE FOR CUT FLOWERS**, but exhibitors may supply their own.
- 7. The Society and Committee will take every reasonable care but will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
- 8. Please place exhibits in a saucer, if you wish your entry to be watered during the Show.
- 9. The decision of the Judges is final. They have power to withhold any award if the exhibits are deemed to be unworthy.

- 10. Exhibits and prize cards **must not** be removed until after **4.30pm** on Sunday 25 September 2022. Failure to comply will forfeit prize money. The Society and Committee will try to ensure the safety of all exhibits, but no responsibility will be taken for any loss or damage. Stewards will be in attendance until 6pm.
- 11. IF EXHIBITORS ARE UNABLE TO STAGE THEIR EXHIBIT/S, WOULD THEY PLEASE INFORM THE SHOW OFFICE BY TUESDAY, 20 SEPTEMBER 2022
- 12. Any objection must be made in writing to the Show Secretary before 3.00pm on the first day of the Show, together with a deposit of £5.00, which will be retained if the objection is not upheld by the Committee.
- 13. Prize money will be paid by cheque and forwarded after the show by post.
- 14. The Show is open to all exhibitors who need not be resident within the three counties of Herefordshire, Worcestershire or Gloucestershire.
- 15. Competitors entering in classes 1A 2A, 3A, 1F, 1G and 19L, will receive an admission pass. For all other classes, one pass per exhibitor for not fewer than **5 entries**.
- 16. One vehicle pass will be issued to exhibitors to enable them to deliver and collect their exhibits. Please use the Yellow Gate off Blackmore Park Road. Once delivery has been completed all vehicles must be removed from the showground to the car parks. The appropriate wristbands will be given to exhibitors when they collect their class cards, in accordance with regulation 15. If you have also entered the CANNA UK Giant Vegetables Championship, your wristbands will be issued with the Exhibit cards for the Giant Vegetable section.
- 17. Exhibitors wishing to park in the Harvest Pavilion car park must be in by 3pm on Sunday 25 September 2022, otherwise they will have to park in the Yellow car park and will not be allowed entry until 6.15pm. There will be no vehicle exits from the Harvest Pavilion car park between 8am and 6.15pm on Show days.
- 18. The Society's general show regulations will apply to this section. Copies are available from the main office.
- 19. All classes to be judged in accordance with the Royal Horticultural Society rules, 8th Edition, 2016, except where stated otherwise in the schedule.
- 20. Please consider the environmental impact of your exhibit. **The use of plastic-containing floral foam is prohibited.** Please choose environmentally responsible alternatives where possible.
- 21. Collection of cups and trophies: please liaise with the Main Office Reception.
- 22. Regulations will be observed in line with Government guidance regarding CoVid19 at the time of the event.
