The Rules

- I. The judge's decision is final.
- 2. Maximum of two entries per person, per class.
- 3. All exhibits to have been grown or made by entrant.

4. No exhibits to be removed before 4.30pm.

- 5. All exhibitors to supply own containers, vases, plates, etc., for showing.
- Points in the Show will be awarded as follows:
 For each 1st 5 points
 For each 2nd 3 points
 For each 3rd 1 point
- 7. All entries will incur an entry fee and this must be paid in full when the entry is placed.
- 8. All exhibitors will receive one free pass to allow them to attend the Greenmeadow Show. In addition all children entering will be given a free adult pass and anyone entering more than two adult classes will receive an additional free adult pass.

Preparation and Presentation

The following tips on preparing and presenting exhibits may be useful:

All vegetables should be properly washed and under no circumstances should oil or any other substance be used.

Beetroots, Carrots and Parsnips should have leaves removed, leaving no more than 3'' stalks.

Onions, except small salad onions (Spring Onions), should be shown without tops and with roots trimmed.

Potatoes should be washed and displayed on a plastic plate.

Tomatoes should be uniform in size and must have the calyxes left on.

The organisation accepts no responsibility or liability for any loss of property of any exhibitor and it is the responsibility of the exhibitors for the safe removal of exhibits after the Show.

Any produce not required by exhibitors after the Show will be greatly appreciated and will be auctioned to the public.

Trophies

Trophies will be held for one year.

The Greenmeadow Community Farm Chairman's Trophy will be awarded for the most points obtained.

The John Cunningham Trophy will be awarded for the best tray of vegetables – Class 26.

The Sarah Richards Trophy will be awarded for the best vase of 5 Chrysanthemums (any variety) – Class 36.

The Bob Wellington Trophy will be awarded for the best vase or bowl of mixed Dahlias – Class 45.

The Bert Ford Memorial Trophy will be awarded for the best craft exhibit.

The Rowly Parfitt Trophy will be awarded for the best cookery exhibit.

The Vernon Evans Memorial Trophy will be awarded for the best collection of five varieties of vegetables – Class 18.

The Jim Harris Memorial Award will be awarded for the most points gained in the cut flower classes.

The Ken Smith Memorial Cup will be awarded for the best vegetable collection – Class I.

The Jeff Williams Shield will be awarded for the most points gained in the children's classes.

The Bill King Shield will be awarded for the most points gained in the photography classes.

The Fred Walker Cup will be awarded for the best vase of one specimen Rose - Class 50.

For carrots and parsnips, the top foliage should be trimmed to not more than 3" from the top of the shoulder of the vegetable.

The vegetables should be displayed and remain within an area of $18'' \times 24''$.

A tray or board measuring 18'' × 24'' can be used by the exhibitor on which to display the vegetables, or the area can simply be marked out on the staging. The only garnishing material allowed is parsley. A black base cloth is permitted, or the tray can be painted. No other material is allowed.
