I have an active service improvement and research portfolio. I hold honorary positions inCardiff and Swansea Universities where I teach the principles of safe prescribing in renal disease to undergraduates and postgraduates, and promote collaboration between students, academics and clinicians.



DR SARAH DAVIES

GP in Cardiff with a special interest in diabetes

She qualified at the University of Wales College of Medicine in 2003 and initially trained as a physician, before making the move into general practice and never looked back!

She has continued her interest in diabetes and presents regularly on the subject to colleagues at local and national meetings. She is passionate about general practice, particularly great quality diabetes care in the primary care setting.

GETHIN MORGAN

Practice Pharmacist

I am currently the practice pharmacist for Roath House surgery in Cardiff. I have been in this role for 4 years, having previously worked as a cluster pharmacist for 4 years, and as a community pharmacist prior to this.

As part of my cluster role, I used my independent prescriber qualification to improve atrial fibrillation management across the cluster, in particular in relation to stroke prevention, and have continued this work in my current role. I have provided training to pharmacists within the health board at both undergraduate and postgraduate level, as well as promoting the role of the pharmacist in both my cluster- and practice-based jobs.

I am a Bevan Exemplar, having completed a project looking at the use of smart technology in improving the early detection of AF.



KATE SPITTLE

Advanced Pharmacist Education & PhD researcher

Kate has worked in GP practice in primary care since 2001 following experience in the pharmaceutical industry, community pharmacy and Cardiff university as a teacher practitioner. She has been an Independent prescriber since 2008 and completed the Diploma in Therapeutics at Cardiff medical school in 2014, winning the prize for the top academic performance.

At present she is the National Lead for Wales, for the GP Pharmacist training programme at HEIW and an Independent prescribing tutor at Cardiff University. She also teaches on the prescribing course. Kate is directly employed by a GP practice covering a number of key therapeutic areas including minor illness and deprescribing.

More recently, Kate has joined an independent medical education company focusing on Cardiometabolic disease, Lupus and Achondroplasia



NEIL THOMAS

Senior Lecturer in Nursing (School of Healthcare, Cardiff University)

He qualified as a nurse in the University of South Wales in 1997 and has worked across critical care, and primary care, and research facilities, more recently working as an advanced nurse practitioner covering several GP practices in Cardiff, where he was involved in developing an award-winning case management service for patient with chronic conditions

He has been lecturing at Cardiff University since 2010 and currently leads the independent prescribing programme and is involved in teaching postgraduate and undergraduate health care professionals in all aspects of clinical patient assessment and prescribing. He is also a member of the RPS Nurse Prescribing Advisory Group on behalf of the Chief Nursing Officer for Wales.

GP Pharmacist Prescriber and Associate Professor of Clinical Pharmacy

Simon qualified as a pharmacist in 1999 following a pre-registration year in community pharmacy. He then managed a busy community pharmacy, before beginning a career in academia, initially as a teacher practitioner pharmacist. Over the next 20 years he held a diverse portfolio of educational and leadership posts, encompassing the higher education, NHS and Welsh Government sectors. At the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, Simon volunteered to return to front-line patient care from his educational role within the NHS. Following more than a year spent in secondary care, he moved into the primary care sector and has been a GP pharmacist prescriber since 2021. His special interests include cardiology, diabetes, pain and women's health.
