PEI-THENG AIZLEWOOD

Advanced Pharmacist



I am an Advanced Pharmacist in the Medicines Optimisation Team for Leeds Office of West Yorkshire Integrated Care Board (WYICB). One of my roles is to improve access of new medicines to lower patient cholesterol levels to reduce the risk of heart disease.

I led on a collaborative project with South and East Leeds GP Group called 'Healthier Cholesterol for Your Community' for the Innovation for Health Inequalities Programme (InHIP) and another transformation project with Leeds Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust to improve lipid optimisation by upskilling PCN workforce from the most deprived areas across West Yorkshire.

SUE ALLDRED

PCPA Regional Vice President & Senior Practice Pharmacist



Sue has worked as Senior Practice Pharmacist at Colton Mill Medical Centre in Leeds since 2015. She is also Head of Clinical Pharmacy for South and East Leeds GP Group where she supports and employs clinical pharmacists and technicians on behalf of their member practices and PCNs. She is a HEE GP pharmacy ambassador for Yorkshire and leads the successful Leeds GP pharmacy network. She qualified from Nottingham University in 1996 and initially worked in hospital pharmacy, specialising in rheumatology, care of the elderly, neurology and education and training.

In 2013 she became Care Homes Pharmacist for Leeds South and East CCG, followed by Medicines Optimisation Team Leader and subsequently acting Head of Medicines Optimisation. Sue completed a diploma in clinical pharmacy in 2000 at the University of Bradford and became a non-medical prescriber in 2011 initially specialising in neurology. She is currently studying for a postgraduate certificate in clinical examination at the University of Leeds.

Co-Chair of the UKCPA Cardiology Group. He leads on the delivery of several innovative cardiology medicines optimisation clinics and services. Well published, with specific interest in medicines adherence, person-centred care and cardiometabolic medicines and risk optimisation. Earned multiple recognitions and awards for innovation and excellence in patient care.

HADEEL MOHAMED

Advanced Pharmacist Education & PhD researcher

Hadeel is a senior pharmacist with a background in hospital and general practice and is currently Deputy Head of Clinical Pharmacy and Education Lead for a GP Federation in Leeds.

Hadeel recently founded a mentoring scheme specifically aimed at supporting female pharmacists of ethnically diverse backgrounds to enhance leadership skills (ENIGMA). This has been piloted in Leeds with a vision to expand the scheme nationally. As a member of the RPS Primary Care Expert Advisory Group, Hadeel passionately advocates for the pharmacy profession and recognition of the value that pharmacists add to patient care across all sectors.

In October 2022, Hadeel started a PhD at The University of Bradford, which is exploring medication self-management behaviours in older patients using multiple medicines at the hospital-to-home transition. Hadeel is excited for research to become a more integral part of pharmacy professional roles and champions this nationally as committee member for the Primary Care academic CollaboraTive (PACT) and Research Co-lead of the Primary Care Pharmacy Association (PCPA).
