INTRODUCTION

At the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic regular teaching in our hospital ceased due to the **unpredictable workload** and requirements for **social distancing**.

Our teaching programme had the following goals:

- 1. Provide teaching safely to as many multidisciplinary team members as possible
- 2. Improve team knowledge about paediatrics and neonatology
- 3. Encourage active learning and development of teaching skills

METHOD


- Multiple bitesize teaching sessions (max 30 mins – timed)
- Microsoft Teams allowed for social distancing in the ward and for those shielding to join from home
- Theme of the Week
- "Ten Top Tips" junior lead teaching
- Senior lead small group teaching/ simulation/communication skills
- Quiz of the Week to consolidate learning
- Learning Points board to encourage reflection and collaborative learning
- Pre and post intervention survey

It is possible to set up a teaching programme that is:


- Flexible

Learning Points Board







A post-intervention survey showed the teaching programme had a positive impact on the department


100% of participants stated it had been useful for their day-to-day work.
