A VIRTUAL ERA: ADAPTING AND HOSTING A REGIONAL CONFERENCE DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

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Background

The Yorkshire and Humber School of Paediatrics hosts a trainee led annual conference. The conference is well established within the region with attendance from trainees and consultants working across it's 17 acute trusts. The location of the conference changes within the region every year to encourage attendance from around the region. In 2019 the organising committee added family friendly facilities with live streaming within the venue to help trainees with young children to access the event. The conference consists of plenaries and workshops by national and regional speakers and is an opportunity for trainees to showcase their work. The 2020 conference was hosted virtually due to the pandemic.

Methods

The co-hosts led a committee of 27 trainees in designing, organising and running the conference. The trainees were assigned to subcommittees with delegated responsibilities including advertising, abstracts, posters, workshops, medical students, PAFTAs and conference pack. Preparations for the conference, which was held in November, began in January 2020. The emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic necessitated a

change from the normal routine and developing a new way of delivering

the conference. Committee meetings and the conference were held virtually via Zoom.

An IT professional and a trainee experienced in virtual education were "Zoom Champions" advising on potential pitfalls, helping with practice sessions for the committee and assisting with technical difficulties.
