

Split board construction sewn with unsupported link, stitch secondary sewing with full linen board attachment. Doublures; Leather edged boards with paper onlays; leather joints.




Best Overall Book by a Non-Professional Binder

Acrostics

Crossed structure binding; sewn on a concertina guard; spine and edges coloured with pink acrylics; raised onlays of pink leather. Designs on front and rear in feathered black onlays coated with acrylic gloss. Buttons of vellum and leather. Laminated goatskin. Endleaves of sanded leather; titled on front cover; Buttons in lacunose decorated with gold leaf and brass burnishing wax.




Best Overall Book by a Non-Professional Binder

The text is woven as single sheets. To create an interlocking structure finally woven onto the cover boards. Text and lettering blind embossed, text printed on inkjet printer on translucent paper, Cover paper – (Griffen Mill) with hand decorated woven paste-down strips, bonded tape for flexibility. Leather hand-decorated lettering on cover.

Scandinavia is linked culturally, historically and in many more ways. As it is my cultural heritage I wanted to create a piece of work to reflect this, based on a neutral palette to represent the interlocking of this part of Europe. The images are symbolic representing land, ice, snow and water.





Full calf French binding. Matching doublures.

Blind tooling, airbrushing, different varnishes, Cuircolor leather tan, Oesser colour foils. Fly leaves in Duvall paper.





Full blue goatskin, inlaid coins and onlaid bank notes; blind and gold tooling; coins and bank notes also on doublures, gilt head. Book typeset and printed on parchment by Geert Van Daal – blue paper endleaves, hand sewn endbands; full blue goatskin; inlaid and onlaid notes and coins, leather joints.





Crown book with bearing structure made from one piece of Brown Kraft paper folded to hold the kraft paper pages and thin boards.

What It's Like Here by Jim Moore

The binding combines a contemporary drop-spine structure with an ancient Japanese multi-section technique, sewn with four needles. The glue-less spine of the text block preserves the integrity of the pages and art.

Both book and slipcase are covered with Iris cloth and Bugra paper. The delicate Kaji paper was attached to the boards with drymount tissue. Text printed from polymer plates on a Vandercook Press #4. Paper – mould made Johannot and Japanese Kaji, hand washed with sumi ink. The snow was printed with oil-based ink to act as a resist for the wash.




#### CASED BINDING

Punctuation: A Printer's Study

Full leather three-piece case binding sewn on tapes, Graphite edge, leather endbands. Boards are of plexiglass covered in leather allowing a 'window' to the suede flyleaves, which have leather onlays.






First Prize (The Bernard Middleton Trophy)

Book of Common Prayer/Holy Bible

Full morocco binding with full gilt spine and boards. The original binding was completely broken - all that remained were the damaged boards. No trace of the spine remained.

Leather and board papers removed; board corners repaired by splicing in new sections of millboard. The book was re-sewn and bound in full morocco. The original leather sides and board papers were then re-instated.



The Cottager's Kitchen, Fruit and Flower Gardens by JH Clark

Original Victorian maroon cloth binding with blind stamped decoration on front and back boards and title embossed in gold on the spine. Decoration embossed on spine around the title.

The front and back boards had come loose from the spine. There was white masking tape residue on the spine. The edges of the boards were torn and tattered and the board was exposed. There was masking tape inside the book and insect damage at the top of the pages throughout. Many of the tops of the pages were torn. Original flyleaves missing.





Covered in full Brown Morocco, gold tooled geometric design. Toned handmade paper endleaves, leather joints, hand sewn endbands, covered full brown goatskin, gold tooled design, housed in goatskin and paper drop back box – also gold tooled.

Red French binding with chemise and slipcase. Morocco leather with onlays, gilt edges, gold tooling, hand sewn end bands, hand made coloured endpapers.








