Story

John 21: 1-17

Easter had been the best and worst week of Jesus's life; starting with celebrating with his friends and promises of sticking together, it wasn't long before Jesus was betrayed by one of them, then arrested whilst all the others ran away scared. Jesus was falsely tried, then hung on a cross to die. He was buried in a tomb, then, amazingly, resurrected and came back to his friends and followers. This story takes place after the events of Easter...

Afterwards Jesus turned up by Lake Galilee. It happened like this:

Simon Peter, Thomas, Nathanael, James and John, and two of Jesus' other friends were all together on the shore, looking out across the water, shell-shocked by everything that had happened. "I'm going fishing" announced Simon Peter, and the rest of them all went too - getting into the boat and putting it out to the water.

They fished all night long (because night time is the best time to catch fish) and they caught... nothing. By the end of the night they were feeling tired and grumpy.

Appendix B

Introduction

Whats your favourite age you've ever lived? Why? common answers include: current age | toddler | baby (opportunity to joke about cuddles/eating and pooing!)

Game: Fill the cup

One at a time, each volunteer must pour some water from the jug into the glass, as much as they like - but they are not allowed to spill any over the edge (it may be advisable to limit the quantities of the first pour). The next child then pours some more water into the glass in a similar way with the same rules. Continue in this fashion rotating round the volunteers until a drop spills over the edge of the cup. The tension will mount as they get closer to the rim - Non-spillers are the winners!

NB. Best to use flat Coke (or cold coffee) as a darker liquid is more easily visible. Putting a paper towel underneath the cup helps visibility of spills. You might prefer to used beads or marbles for an easier clean up.

Reflection: When I feel really ill I tend to go back to watch TV shows from when I was younger because they're comforting and familiar and they remind me of the time when everything was easier. Do you do that?

Some days I wake up and I don't want to get up! I groan and I wish I could go back to sleep. Do you do that?

Sometimes I say something and immediately I think "I wish I hadn't said that". "I wish I could take that back". Do you do that?

But you can't go back, once something is done, its done forever and all we can do is go forward – that can be an upsetting thing.

Peter, John and the rest of Jesus' friends had certainly had their lives upset. They had left their jobs and families to follow Jesus. For three years he taught them and trained up, then he had been taken from them and hung on a cross. But after seeing him dead and buried, he had now appeared to them at least three times, alive!

He was telling them that it wasn't time to go back, but to keep moving forwards.

For them it was an emotional rollercoaster - they found the whole thing very difficult to deal with and all they wanted to was go back. Go back to a simple and familiar time and pretend like they hadn't grown up. And so here they are fishing: It's a calming, mindful, familiar activity they know well – it helps them to feel like they've got back to the 'good old days'.

Jesus' friends want to go back. But Jesus gives them something better – something better than all the best things that have ever happened, Jesus invites them to... breakfast! Jesus invites his friends to start again.

Its not pretending that the good things and the bad things never happened, his invitation is to leave those things where they are, and look forward.

And I think we can see in this story that the future is better. Jesus invitation is to friendship, joy, hope, strength, and restoration.

It's so easy to get stuck and wanting to go back especially when right now seems a bit rubbish. Jesus' Easter tells us that you can start again: the future is even better.
