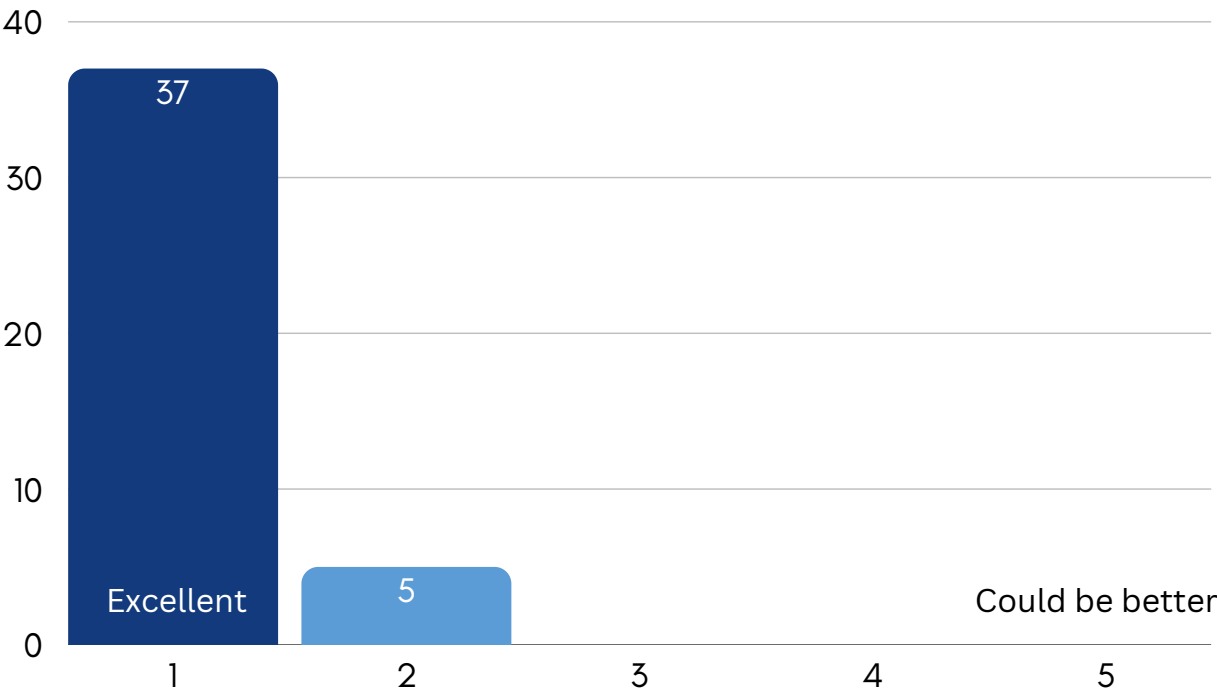
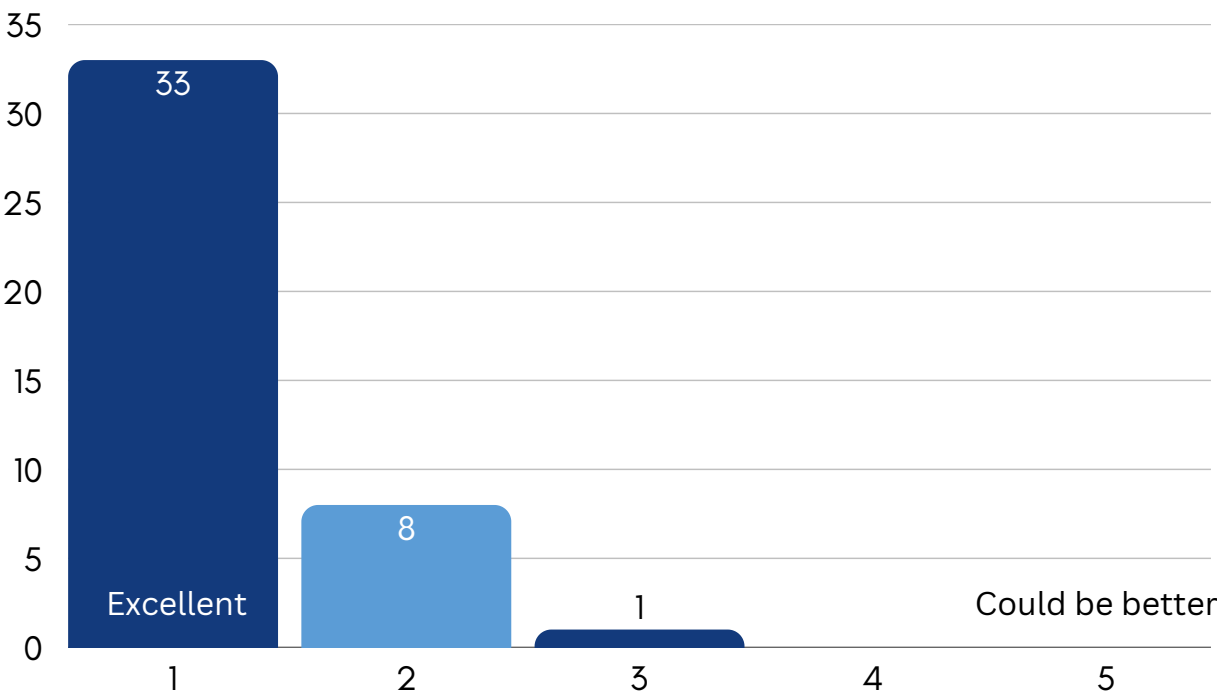


# Spinnaker RE Support Feedback Summary

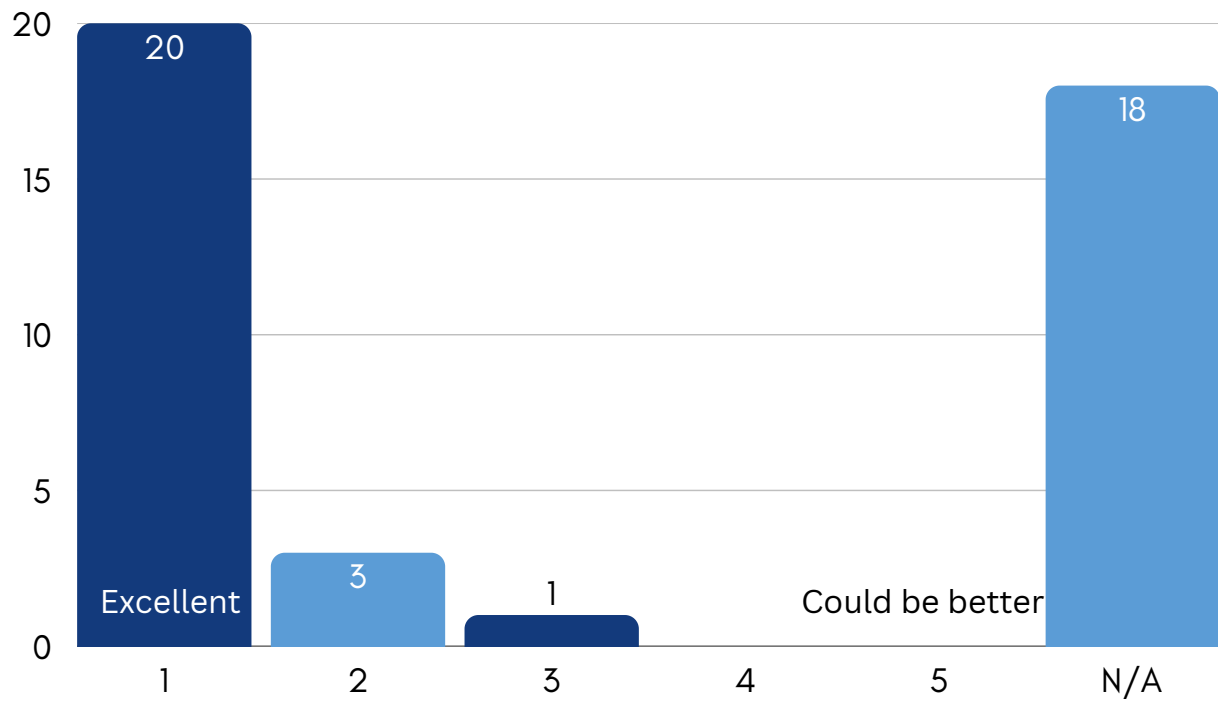
How satisfied are you with the Collective Worship support you receive from Spinnaker?



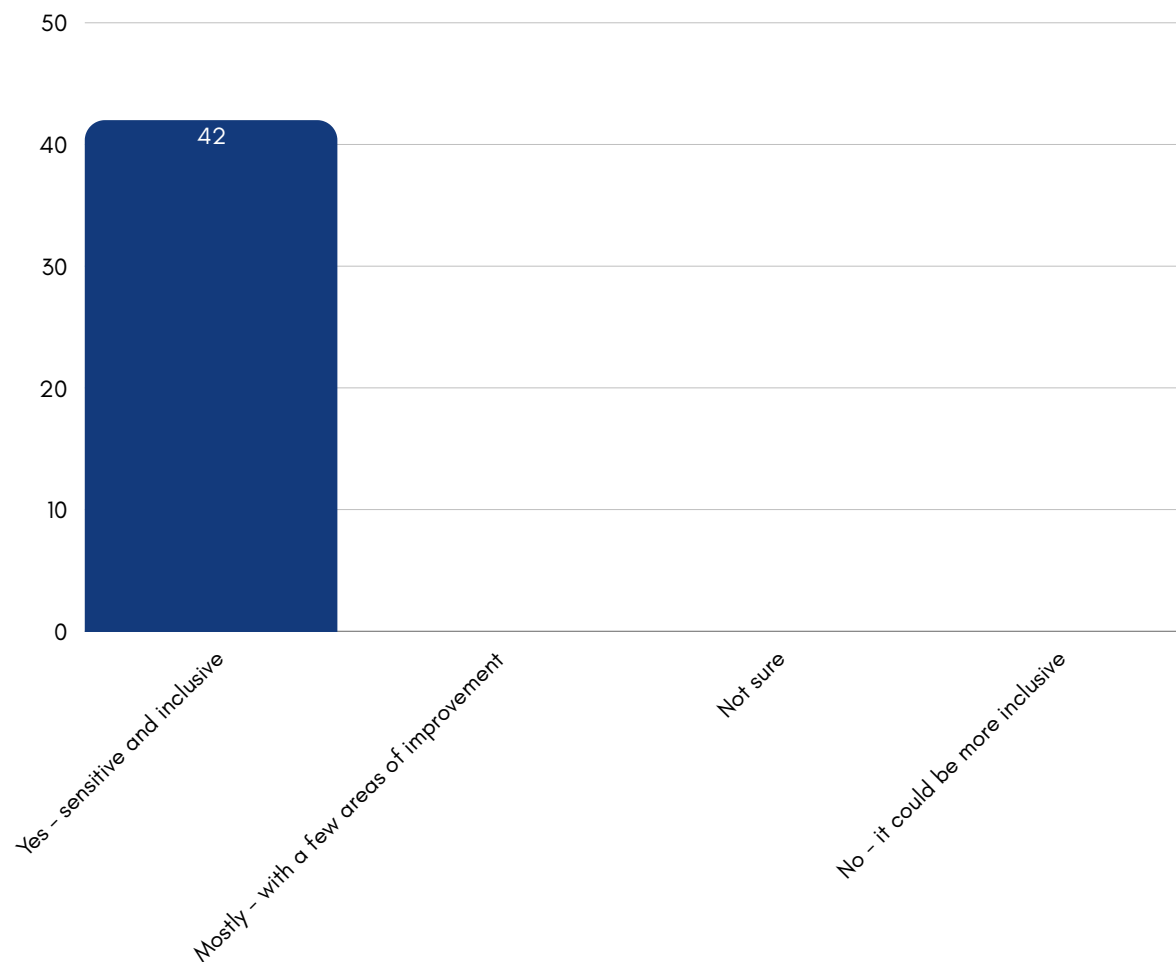
How well does our Collective Worship connect with your students' real-life experiences or classroom learning?

Any comments regarding Spinnaker's Collective Worship that could help us improve:

- We feel they have a great balance of storytelling, drama, pupil engagement, reflection, ect.
- The assemblies are fun, engaging and interactive. Incorporating moral and ethical lessons.
- Some of it is a bit advanced for the pupils at Key Stage 1 Level - the collective worship I mainly lead is Y1 to Y4
- We are very grateful for the support, Sam is amazing!
- Increase volume during the bible story section. Children could help act it out. (Chrissie noted that it was Gill's first time doing the story alone)
- It is very inclusive
- All was excellent.
- We enjoy their interactive assemblies and they often link with our school values
- Sessions really engaging
- At times, some of the content of the assemblies has been a bit complex for our Year 1 / 2 children so maybe some differentiation in places to accommodate different year groups.

To ensure inclusivity and sensitivity to our entire community, as a school we must always ensure that any prayer is optional and that it is clear Christian views being shared are the beliefs of the speaker and not expected of all. Again, this feels well handled, which we appreciate.

- Takeaways - developing the spirituality of pupils and staff beyond worship Prayer Spaces - have been amazing at engaging our school and wider community
- The themes are very similar to the school's RE and PSHE lessons, so the values are reinforced.
- Children are better informed about specific celebrations & have more opportunities to learn about other religions with links to real life context.
- Great to have a different voice and approach to Collective Worship - this really helps giving the children a more rounded worship experience
- We have used some of Chrissie's worship ideas - drama/ key questions/ photographs
- The kids love discussing the assemblies at playtime.
- Brought them joy and excitement about Christianity and the Bible.
- Their assemblies often link with our school values
- Themes continued to be discussed throughout the week in lessons. Children feel uplifted and valued/included because of external visitors.
- The assemblies allow the children to explore themes that can be quite complicated in an easily accessible way. Had they not have been offered, we might not have looked at including some of the themes so this has impacted on the variety of ideas the children have considered and learnt about. It is also great to have Christian input in a meaningful way into a non C of E school.
- The children have a greater understanding of the bible, Jesus and how to be kind to others.
- Brings the Christian message alive and makes it relevant to all pupils
- The assemblies link with our school values
- Linked to values of the school
- Developed social awareness/ responsibility and sense of self!
- The sessions - worships, and RE Days have fully engaged the children, and they are all actively involved. Spinnaker helps to bring bible stories alive and makes them relevant to their lives today.
- The children really engage with the assemblies and often the message aligns with our school values.
- Links really well with our school values.
- The children were fully engaged in all assemblies due to them knowing Heather
- It is great that our children are getting a Christian input.

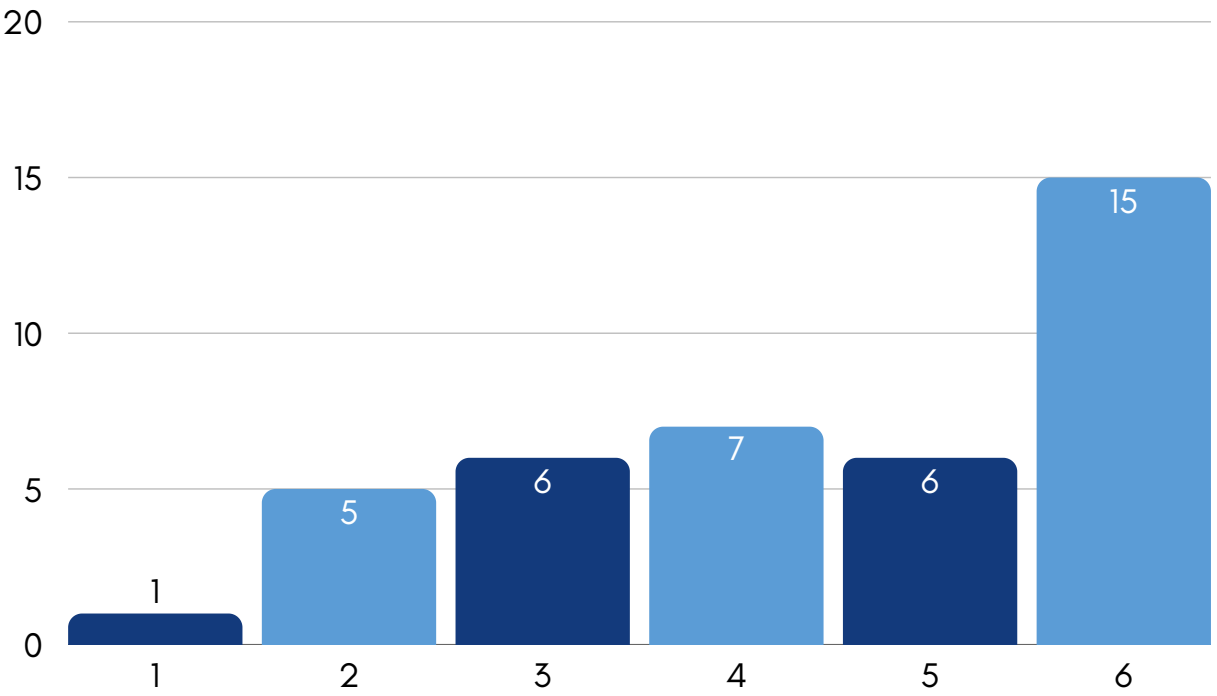
- Always helpful

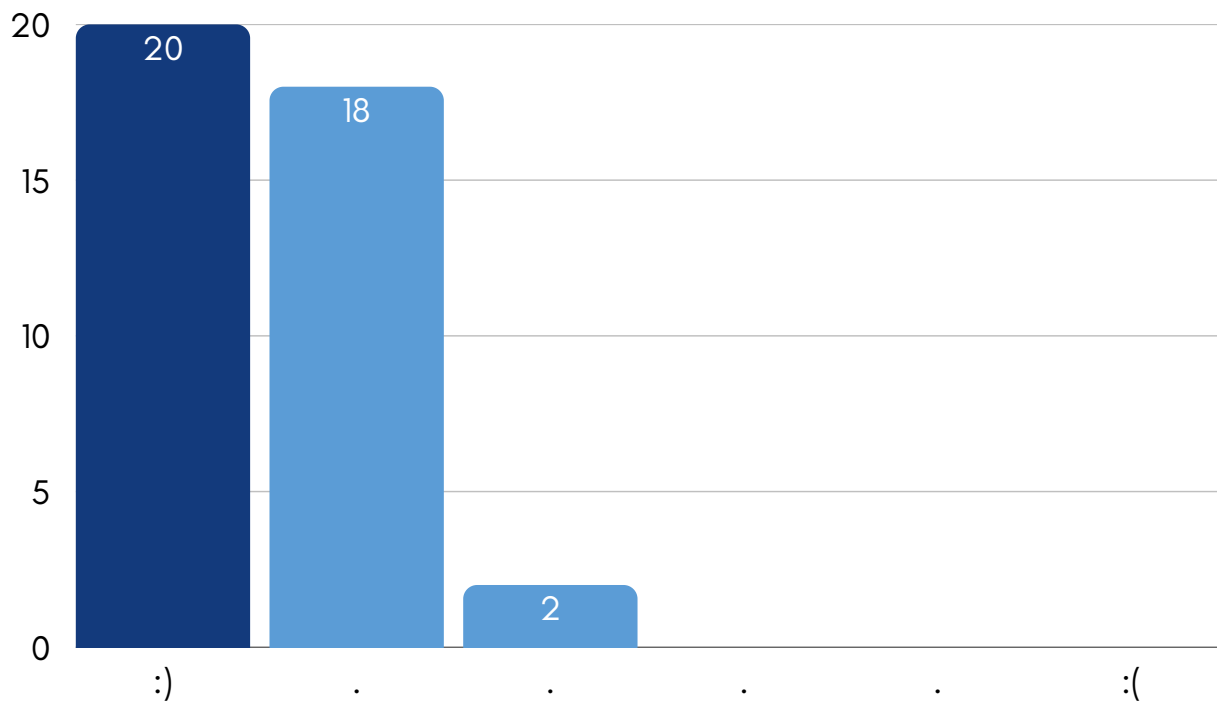
- Thank you for all the support you continue to give our school.
