
A HUGE THANK YOU

WHY WE ARE HERE

Sarah Rockall-Brown has kindly shared her family's story with us...

"At 32 weeks and five days, right before our last antenatal class, my waters broke. Once labour was confirmed, my husband Max made a very late-night call to my mum who answered the phone with, 'Sarah's in labour, isn't she?'. Although unexpected, this wasn't unfamiliar territory, as I was born at 28 weeks and my brother at 32 weeks. Our son, Oscar, was delivered safely a few hours later, and we were both lucky enough to have a cuddle before he was taken to the HDU. Thankfully, all initial tests were positive, and after a few days Oscar was moved to the LDU where he spent just under a month 'feeding and growing'.

During this time, the SSNAP team were tremendously supportive, always there with a friendly smile and listening ear. They helped to make Christmas in hospital special with a lovely gift box, and it was reassuring to know that when we were discharged their support would continue. Oscar is a thriving nine-month-old now, and we have been regularly attending the fantastic Little SSNAPlings sessions. It's been so comforting spending time with other families who've had similar experiences.

Back in May, Max, a self-confessed non-runner, completed the Blenheim 7K to raise money for SSNAP. In October, he will be running the Oxford Half Marathon, echoing my dad who ran the London Marathon for the charity back in 1990. I guess it really does run in the family!"

- Funding a certificate-based programme designed to empower clinicians to deliver compassionate, trauma-informed developmental care tailored to the unique needs of vulnerable newborns.
