# Cooperatives de Treball (l'FCTC)



### **Case study**

Worker control important element of degrowth policy suggestions. Theory development primary location in Catalunya means l'FCTC key candidate for understanding self directed strategy development.



### Standing in interrelation

I'FCTC composed of 655 workers cooperatives. It forms part of a complex ecosystem of organisations which enable the cooperative movement to develop strategies. The vast majority of coops are expanding or recently founded. Secondary networks and incubators supporting development.



### Journey towards addressing social issues

Participants explained that members of the federation have campaigned internally for a move from a focus on legislation and services with rigid structure to be more open since the 2011 movement of the squares and rise of new cooperativism in the region.

# **Data Collection**

# **Study** parameters

- The study focuses on worker cooperatives who are actively interested and engaged in planning processes around degrowth and eco-oscial transition
- I'FCTC chosen for breadth of interview subjects, but additional interviews outside Catalunya carried out for instance in the bicycle industry

# Duration and scope

- Four visits, total of half a year
- Limitations around coops spare time and language mitigated by returning in quiet period of the year and provision of translation
- Interviews of around one hour and reflections written where interviews weren't appropriate or of events.

# Cooperatives and industries

- Worker cooperatives in green industries
- Snowball sampling, interviewees making recommendation of key actors, coops and networks
- Multistakeholder cooperatives with significant worker control
- Geographical spread across region

# Levels and ac-

- Shared goals with coperatives around research questions
- Access made possible through my position as a participant of cooperative networks and a worker cooperative in the U.K
- Interviews with members of key cooperatives in ecosystem development





# What is the Social and Solidarity Economy?

- Experienced expansion due to work of social movements related to the indignados movements in early 2010's
- -Pamapam.org map 1,300 georeferenced initiatives spread across 15 economic activity sectors.
- Obligatory accounting process 'Social Balanc' which assesses XES organisations on metrics including; internal hierarchy, social transformation, personal development, feminist perspectives.
- Concept developed by coops, third sector and also supported by the state.

The Ateneus Network is supported financially by the Ministry for Work and Social Economy.





# Results

#### **Coding**

- Interviews transcribed and translated
- Interviews are being analysed using FOSS qualititative data programme QualCoder.
- Theme codebook created to interpret data in relation to research questions

#### **Themes**

- Interview data, associated documentation and the code-book of themes will be used to build a narrative in response to my research questions. Initial findings show
- Worker cooperatives are key component of practical development of degrowth initiatives in the region.
- Development primarily happens in cooperative ecosystems. This is how scale is achieved. Partially contingent on supportive legislative environment.

#### **Extension**

- The study focuses on worker cooperatives who are actively interested and engaged in planning processes around degrowth and eco-oscial transition. Final interviews could delve more into how having this core driving cooperative strategy affects other actors.
- Role of certain ecological consultancy cooperatives and XES staff could be explored.
- Placement of Catalan developments in international context such as GKN workers more neutral approaches like SDG's.

# **Next steps**

Beyond research how can cooperatives be part of the eco-social transition?



### **Futurs Imposible**

- With XES the forum is hosting regular regional visioning sessions in smaller towns and rural areas across the region.
- The forum spurred the formation of Catalan assembly for eco-social transition as ongoing nexus of strategy
- CGT Union creating report on necessary steps to transform all sectors of economy.



### workers.coop

- U.K federation of workers cooperatives recommend to develop shared ecological approach, and supporting ecosystems.
- Concept of ESS being dominated by Social Enterprise means lack of distinction between systemic approach and standard corporate responses.
