From the times when wealthy and powerful people started to privatise common land, there have been those who aspired to a co-operative commonwealth. Ownership of land, trade and industry gives unregulated power to the owner at the expense of the lives of the multitude who are forced to work for them. Thus, the industrial revolution mechanised a criminal exploitation of the masses of ordinary people who saw no alternative but to work in unregulated industry. It was during these times that the concept of Cooperation came into being. That a Co-operative Commonwealth could be brought about where the people who worked on and consumed the produce of the land, also owned it. Private interests and competition could be eliminated, through people cooperating with each other and owning and controlling land, industry and trade. A new society could be created where innovative models of industry and distribution could be democratised for the benefit of all people. And life could then become more human, social and truly fulfilling.

Does this sound impossibly utopian?

Huge progress has been made towards the Cooperative Commonwealth. There have also been huge setbacks.


