





Post-operative complication rates in feline and canine neutering

- 8.2% to 9.1% of all cases (n=30,000) involve one or more abnormalities requiring medical treatment or surgical intervention.
- In both species, spays suffered more complications needing treatment or surgical intervention than castrates
- Neutering of dogs and bitches triggered more abnormalities than the equivalent procedures in cats
- The figures have remained remarkably static when compared to those of previous years showing a need to focus on improvements
