

#### **Treasurer**

#### Report for Year Ended 31 December 2014

(see also Summary Accounts p.26)

The Association's finances remain sound. For the year to 31 December 2014 our income exceeded our expenditure by £4,790. This is because of a successful series of events, including the Opera (total surplus of around £3,350), and additional grants received (totalling £9,978) for the work of Energy Efficient Widcombe.

We have total net assets of £17,614 (last year £12,039) including £111 (last year £111) in a fund

reserved for the Abbey Cemetery.

Where we get our money from We have a total income, including from subscriptions, grants and events of £30,974 (last year £23,312). Grants were received this year from BANES £180 to support the Mummers and from BANES (£3,688), BGC (£2,290), Continuum (£2,000) and Quartet (£2,000) all to support the work of Energy Efficient Widcombe.

How we spend our money Our income was used to fund our activities and events, cover our running costs and make donations to relevant local causes. Donations in 2014 were made to Widcombe Junior School Robotics (£200), Widcombe Junior School Great Hall (£318) and St Thomas Church (£216). 2014 saw the continued work of the Energy Efficient Widcombe (EEW) initiative with new income in the year of £9,987 and expenditure of £7,586. Further work is continuing in 2015 funded by the grants received in 2014.

The Widcombe Choir goes from strength to strength with income fully covering the choir's running costs since its formation.

For the first time we have developed a Widcombe Calendar and post cards for sale. Once final sales are received in January this will show a reasonable surplus.

The remainder of funds were used to run our events and clubs (£8,731), administration costs and general purchases (£2,490).

We are holding some additional reserves in case funds are needed to support the completion of the Rossiter Road scheme and to underwrite the proposed Widcombe Street Party.

A summary of the accounts is included below. These have been subject to an independent review. Full accounts, are available at the AGM and subsequently on our website.

Membership Renewal Membership is due for the 2014 year from 1 January 2014 at the new rates of £10 for Housholds, £20 for Businesses and £5 for individual students. So you should have now paid. Thank you for everyone that has. This can be via direct debit, standing order, Paypal (via the website site) or by cash payment to the membership secretary. Please, if you have not done so, make sure if you have a standing order that it is for the right amount of £10 (or £20 for business members) and if you pay by direct debit you must cancel any preexisting standing orders with your bank (we can not do this for you).

#### Rossiter Road Scheme



In the October newsletter I wrote about the project moving at "breathtaking speed" and the efforts of the contractors "to keep us all informed". Almost as soon as the Newsletter went to press, it was revealed that the contractors had encountered "financial difficulties" and work stopped. Unfortunately, ours was only one of several projects that ERH were undertaking for the Council and it seems that overall the workforce has reduced and that the remaining personnel are being juggled between projects. The result is, that although work has recommenced, progress is slow and target dates are not being met. At the time of writing, works on the south side of the Parade (see completed stretch in picture) which, under the revised programme, were

due to be finished by the end of February were then scheduled for the 13th March and at the time of writing have already yet again overrun. We've been promised completion by the end of April but, in the absence of a detailed implementation plan, this seems extremely unlikely. By the time you read this, we might have a clearer picture. In the meantime, in the absence of a plan, communications can be summed up as "too little too late".

What a pity that after over 30 years of campaigning, implementation of the scheme is causing such inconvenience for local residents and, worse still, such a dreadful impact on our traders.

not yet available. A further major issue is that, for safety reasons, all road and pedestrian bridges over the railway will have to have their parapets raised. In Bath many of these structures are listed or are protected, being within the Conservation Area. Again, the detailed designs for the new parapet extensions have not yet been made available. Network Rail, which is responsible for the electrification of the line, is discussing the design issues with Bath and North East Somerset Council and with English Heritage. Regular monthly drop-in sessions are held in the Guildhall, open to all, where Network Rail staff are available to discuss all aspects of the project.

#### Rail Electrification

Works on the project to electrify the GWR line from London Paddington to Bristol are due to start this summer. There will be short term impacts including line closures as the track is lowered in places to provide height for the overhead gear. There will also be long terms impacts including the introduction of the pylons and overhead wires, and the need to carry out some felling or trimming of vegetation adjacent to the line. Given its status as a World Heritage Site and Conservation Area, special supports for the overhead lines are being designed for the section through Bath, but the designs are

Widcombe Parade – recognition as local centre One of the issues

we have raised in response to the Council's Placemaking Plan Options is that the area currently defined on the Local Plan Proposals Map as Widcombe's local centre is too restrained, particularly now that we have the new Morrisons store at the eastern end. We have made the case that is should be extended east to include this (and the White Hart) and west to include the Widcombe Surgery and offices.

We have registered WA support for the protection from future development of a number of important local green spaces. We are also supporting a number of allotment sites in Widcombe, being promoted by Virginia Williamson, who has done a great deal of research into these sites.

Widcombe Old School The WA were approached towards the end of last year regarding a concept for redevelopment of Widcombe Old School, adjacent to St Mark's cemetery. It is currently in use by Tim



Richards' architectural modelling practice, but the building is understood to be in poor condition. No plans have yet been seen but the owner is proposing to demolish the existing building and to build new homes on the site. The most likely plan would

As we go to press, we expect the imminent confirmation of the Traffic Order for the introduction of the extended 20MPH zone within Lyncombe and Widcombe. WA has requested that 20mph zones extend

from Widcombe Parade to just beyond the Tyning on Widcombe Hill, and just beyond Perrymead/Church St on Ralph Allen Drive. We have also emphasised the importance of minimising signage to avoid street clutter.

be for between six and eight townhouses which should not be higher than the existing building. Access could be an issue as well as the loss of employment space - which Council policy seeks to protect.

Beechen Cliff School Floodlights Sadly, the floodlighting to the all-weather MUGA pitches continue to cause considerable disturbance and distress to local residents - apparently often unnecessarily (when the pitches are not in use). There has been no evidence of the usage of the independent switching which we understood to have been installed. This indicates that the management plan the school was required to prepare is not being put into effect and is also in our view a clear breach of their planning conditions which require compliance with the lighting institute's guidelines. This has been brought to the attention of the Council and we wait to see what enforcement action will be taken. At the event to showcase the School's new master plan (see p.16) a number of discussions were had with governors and the design consultants who were generally sympathetic with the concerns of local residents over the problems with the current floodlights and there seemed a real interest in finding solutions. #### **Improving Widcombe**

Since the members' meetings in December and January work has been proceeding on the implementation of the ideas for Improving Widcombe. Future action is being planned under four main topics: Entry to Widcombe, Environment and Planning, Transport and Widcombe Parade. Small groups are being formed from those who volunteered at the two meetings, and these groups will be charged both with promoting improvements to Widcombe, and seeking action to address problems that are identified within the area.

Much of the work identified is already underway, for example, the improvement of local signing to and within Widcombe led by Sarah Lewis, and the completion of the works in the Parade and on Rossiter Road with the sub- committee headed by Richard Wales. New groups are being formed, notably a rail group that will be keeping a close watch on the potential impacts on Widcombe of the rail electrification programme, a cycling group to promote cycling within Widcombe, and a group to promote sustainability.

Other projects that continue to be pursued under the umbrella of Improving Widcombe are improvements to the underpass by the Churchill roundabout (Helen Peter) and new lighting on the Ha'penny bridge (Paddy Doyle). Jan Shepley and Mike Wrigley will continue to monitor and report on planning and transport issues. There is also interest in forming a group to promote improvements to the natural environment, and another to focus attention on the western parts of Widcombe. Finally a group is being formed that will consider the river and the canal as they pass through Widcombe, both in terms of access and use. It is anticipated that once the Rossiter Road scheme is finally completed, the sub-committee that has pressed for the implementation of the project will be retained, perhaps in a different form and with different people, to monitor the operation of the scheme and to promote further improvements.



There was a good turnout on 19th March for the event at OFSTED-rated 'outstanding' Beechen Cliff School to publicise their new master plan for the development of the school over the next 10 years. The plans are certainly aspirational, one of the four values the school seeks to embrace (along with compassion, independence and balance) and the concept designs are striking.

Headmaster Andrew Davies explained that there are no plans to increase the school roll, which has now reached 1200, but that the spatial needs of this number of pupils exceed the current provision by about 1,000 sq m, in relation to modern standards. Much of the existing accommodation is unsuitable for delivering today's curriculum and is also in poor condition.

The new plans, which have been realised with the help of consultants Batterham Matthews Design Ltd (studios in Batheaston), are bold and befitting of a school of the high reputation of Bath's former grammar school.

The proposals involve a new science centre, theatre/performing arts space, new sports centre and pavilion and construction of an additional floor across the whole of the original main building, to accommodate arts studios. The plans also include a new boarding house (for 40-45 boarders) for which 3 siting options are suggested - two on either end of the lower playing field alongside Greenway Lane (which WA would not support, as we have supported Greenway in its efforts to have this field designated a local green space) and the third to replace

an existing bungalow at the main entrance to the School. No parking will be provided to serve this building.

Other aspects of the plan involve the use of the current tennis courts to create more on-site parking (an increase of 195% according to the architects) a loop road for access instead of the present cul-desac and the creation of two new pitches on levelled lower fields, one of which to be all-weather (but unlit, we are assured) and providing new tennis courts, available for use by the local community.

The school hopes that this aspirational plan will provide the basis for funding bids and planning applications and will be achievable over the course of the next ten years.

The school is to be applauded for its clarity of vision for its future and these early designs are exciting. There is, however, the potential for the amenity of local residents to be affected, and assessments will have to be made not only of the impacts of the development proposals on surrounding residential areas but on the World Heritage City. In addition, there may be concerns particularly in relation to accompanying lighting of the site and buildings on what is a very prominent location.

Feedback on the concept plan was invited, particularly on the location of the boarding house. The WA will be making its own comments, and you can send yours via email to



Over a considerable period of time, FoBRA has been involved in discussions about the transport situation in Bath and was pleased to welcome the adoption of the Bath Transport Strategy in November.

Jan Shepley and Mike Wrigley, two of our WA committee members, put in a considerable amount of work with the FoBRA Working Group, looking at the response to the Council's Placemaking Plan. After a number of drafts and lively consultation with member RAs, which largely reflected agreement with the Working Group findings, a response was finally submitted in January and included comments on the Transport Strategy, use of

brownfield sites before greenfield, treating central Bath as a "Place" and a student housing policy, amongst others.

FoBRA is currently discussing its priorities for the next couple of years. WA put forward the River, footpaths and the Public Realm and getting council action on publishing strategies. The long list will be reduced to a short list at the next FoBRA meeting and the final priorities agreed at the AGM in May.

The usual Winter Reception was held in Victoria Art Gallery on Tuesday 20th Jan 2015, with guests from the Council, Police, the Business Community and Parliamentary candidates. This provided an excellent opportunity for members to speak to local leaders and to share ideas.

# energy efficient widcombe

Energy Efficient Widcombe have had a busy winter, thanks to the funding they received from the Quartet Community Foundation for undertaking Thermal Imaging Surveys in local homes. This funding has allowed EEW to cover an ever greater spread of Widcombe homes in our third consecutive year of Thermal Imaging. Our hardy volunteers have headed out on many a cold winter evening and morning to discover, more often than not, that many of our residents are well insulated and very much on the ball about making their homes as warm and efficient as possible. Nevertheless, through our reports we endeavour to provide useful energy efficient advice specifically targeted at each individual home. We have received some great feedback, and reports of our recommendations being actioned: "I am working through the recommendations and had insulated the loft access door within a day of your visit."

"I think it was a very useful and informative exercise!"

If you or any of your neighbours have not yet availed themselves of our Thermal Imaging Scheme, then do get in touch to book a place for next winter's tranche of surveys which will begin in November 2015, kindly funded by St John's Hospital

Also occupying our time has been our engagement with Widcombe Junior School's Great Hall Project. Now that this project has gone back to the design drawing board, so to speak, and that the school are considering the Hall to be as much a community building as a school one, Energy Efficient Widcombe feel this is a great opportunity for Widcombe to gain a landmark sustainable building. As such, we have submitted a report detailing our vision for a new sustainable building that could act as a combination of school hall, learning centre and community space. We researched similar projects and drew together a list of practical recommendations for the Great Hall Project Team to feed into their brief to architects and designers. Energy Efficient Widcombe hope to continue to be involved throughout the procurement process.

Staying with Widcombe Junior School, now that Spring has sprung, Energy Efficient Widcombe will be heading back into the classrooms to undertake workshops with each year group. We hope to cover a range of sustainable issues, including building, food and transport. We are looking for volunteers to support these workshops, which will take place in April, so please get in touch if you are interested in helping out.

I have now been the coordinator for two months and am really enjoying the position; and with the volunteer team I am looking forward to Energy Efficient Widcombe having a very productive and active 2015.



In such a tight area, bounded by the road and the canal basin, it has been necessary to use the Club site to work from while completing the student accommodation and Morrisons store.

Contractors are now laying foundations for the new Club premises (see picture) which will take up almost the whole of the site. There will be a side path, adjacent to the church wall, wide enough for a vehicle to load and unload.

The building will be on three levels, connected by stairs and a lift. There will be a public bar on the lower floor with a small outdoor deck area, and the top floor will have a large room (capacity 180) with a bar, overlooking the canal. Planning detail for interior decoration and furnishings will aim to create a comfortable, warm but unobtrusive environment with flexible and responsive lighting, and provision will be made for wifi and a hearing loop. If the fitout budget allows, there will be flexible, demountable staging and possibly some PA and stage lighting equipment.

The new Club premises will be open 7 days a week, for daytime use as well as evenings. WSC will run its own events for members and a wider public – music, films, cabarets, dances, indoor sports (e.g. darts) family activity days, quizzes etc. Sporting teams and other interest groups will be encouraged to use the Club as a base.

Rooms will also be available for hire for all sorts of

uses including promotions (e.g. Folk Club, Comedy Festival), wedding receptions and parties, business meetings, workshops and classes, and community activities such as Mother and Toddler groups.

A professional project manager is overseeing the construction and mechanical and electrical fit-out on WSC's behalf, to ensure that the building is delivered according to the contract with the developer. Committee members and other volunteer advisers are working alongside the project manager on a detailed brief for the interior fit-out work which will be put out to tender and overseen by WSC when the building is handed over.

Others are working on plans for an initial programme of activities and events; attracting other users to hire the facilities; developing benefits and privileges of membership; and requisite marketing and PR.

The Club will soon advertise for a full-time Manager, planned to be in post from the handover of the building in order to prepare the run-up to full opening towards the end of the year.
